## CURRICULUM CORNER: END OF YEAR REPORTING

Despite that fact that the Labour Government has abandoned National Standards and the reporting requirements that have been part of these in the past, schools are still expected to report as usual this year until the government makes decisions on a pathway forward in this area. At school this week, end of year assessments have continued. This process provides important information on student achievement and progress over the year and helps to inform decisions (Overall Teacher Judgements) made in relation to curriculum level achievement. This information is also used to identify students requiring additional support in 2019 and those students who would benefit from enrichment or extension opportunities and programmes. Teachers have been working very hard compiling end of year profiles and assessing students against the appropriate curriculum level expectations for the different year levels and age groups. Two very important processes are part of this work.

- **Moderation** is the process where teachers compare judgements to either confirm or adjust them. The process involves teacher collaboration to establish a shared understanding of what achievement looks like and whether or not the student has demonstrated achievement at the appropriate curriculum level. Teachers work towards making judgements that are consistent and comparable. In our school this means that teachers working with students from the same year levels get together with students' work samples and compare their assessment marks.
- **“OTJ” – overall teacher judgement.** An OTJ involves drawing on and applying the evidence gathered up to a particular point in time, in order to make an overall judgement about a student's progress and achievement. We call this triangulation which means teachers will use at least three different sources of information to support their judgements. For example in reading teachers may use a score from a nationally referenced test such as PAT or STAR Reading Test, a running record or probe reading test completed by the student, a comprehension activity completed in class, information located by a student for a presentation or inquiry and/or a discussion about a book with a student to help make their judgement about where the student is at in terms of the appropriate curriculum levels. It is a very complex and time consuming process because our teachers want to ensure that they are making well-informed and accurate decisions.

## HEALTH & SAFETY MATTERS – SCHOOL ROAD PATROLS

Recently there have been reports from staff members about unsafe behaviour by parents around our school patrols. This has included:

- Two different cars being driven through the school road patrols when patrollers have the barriers out to let children cross.
- Parents illegally parking on yellow painted lines, impeding the vision of the patrollers who do not have a clear view of traffic approaching the patrols as a result.
- Please contact the office if you are concerned about unsafe driving around our school particularly at drop off and pick up times.
- We have approached the local police to advise them of our concerns and they will be patrolling our crossings more vigilantly over the next few weeks.
- **Police have also advised us that when cars are not following traffic rules and expectations, especially around school patrol crossings, we are to note the registration number or the name of the driver if we can identify them, complete a police notification form that goes to the police who will then follow up the complaint with the driver concerned.**
- We remind parents that children are not allowed to walk through our carpark without an adult.
- The CODC Roding Division is currently working on new signage for our main pick up and drop off areas on Molyneux Avenue and Monaghan Street which will become soon become 5 min drop off areas.
- Thanks to the many parents who drive carefully around our school, especially at drop off and pick up times. We do appreciate your support, as we want to ensure that all our children can walk and bike safely to and from school.

## SATURDAY MORNING MUSIC IN CENTRAL 2019


