## DEAR PARENTS AND FRIENDS

### NGĀ MIHI NUI KI A KOUTOU KATOA.

The children and staff have returned to school this week refreshed and ready to tackle a busy Term Three. Our Winter Outdoor Pursuits Programme commences tomorrow for our Year 3 students with their first skating trip to the Alexandra Skating Rink, a second day is scheduled next Thursday 2 August. Years 4-6 ski days at Cardrona are planned for Tuesday 14 & 21 August. Hārewa Team skating in Queenstown is scheduled for later in the term during Weeks 8 & 9. Skiing and skating, combined with cross country events will keep everyone very active throughout the term. Our Opportunities Programme this term includes Chess Club, Special Choir and a variety of music tuition groups and external competitions. We are also offering an indoor lunch time activity each day in different classrooms this term. This has been added because we no longer have the library available for students to use during the longer break. Our Kapa Haka Group has already commenced weekly practices in preparation for their performance at the Murihiku Polyfest in Invercargill on Thursday 30 August. ## TERM 3 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

Mathematics programmes will include multiplication/division and fractions, decimals and percentages; strand maths is Geometry & Measurement, the development of problem solving skills will continue. Inquiry will look different across the school – Ako will be continuing with projects liked to their science learning about space in Term 2, Kārearea & Hārewa will be exploring the concept of sustainability through the Social Studies context of ancient civilisations. The Te Reo topic is Te Huarere (weather), PE will include fitness training for cross country, skiing/skating and later in the term athletics. Literacy programmes in reading and writing continue to build reading comprehension and decoding skills along with spelling and an exposure to a variety of writing styles and purposes.

## SCHOOL COUNCIL NEWS

School Council weekly meetings commenced on Monday. This term will be busy for the councillors who will be observing at a Student Council Meeting at Cromwell College and raising funds for the children's charity that every class had the opportunity to vote on in Term 1. ***Ronald McDonald House was the clear winner for 2018.*** The council discussed a recent newspaper article about fundraising that is currently happening for a Ronald McDonald House to be built in Dunedin, so any funds we raise this term will be donated to this particular project. Councillors have developed a fundraising plan that will include a cupcake partnership with the Cromwell Polytech students and a mufti day. These events will be advertised during the term.

The council is also excited that SOKs (Support our Kids) parents' group has partnered with them, to raise funds for the addition of a new swing to our playground. Student voice has been asking for a replacement swing ever since the old tyre swing was removed from the Junior Playground, to make way for the redevelopment of this area during the Tremendous Makeover some years ago. To install a safe and sturdy swing is costly, so in order to achieve this goal, the councillors approached SOKs and asked for their help. The recent raffle organised by SOKs got this project off to a flying start with an amazing \$5,300 contributed to the swing fund. The council is excited that this year, their goal of bringing a swing back to our playground will be achieved. Thanks SOKs.

The council would also like to thank the school community for the fantastic response to the mufti day held to support the two boys who lost many personal possessions in a house fire near the end of last term. An amazing \$800 was raised, so we were able to send each boy, off for their Term 2 holidays with a new puffer jacket, \$100 cash, \$100 Paper Plus Voucher and a \$50 Warehouse voucher.



## HEALTH & SAFETY NEWS

### SCHOOL'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE CARE OF CHILDREN BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL

At the beginning of the new school term it is timely that we remind parents of the following expectations:

- School staff are responsible for students on the school grounds from when they arrive at school **after 8:30am**, and for **15 minutes after school**. **There should not be any students dropped off at school prior to 8:30am unless a special arrangement has been made with the class teacher involved.**
- Bus students will be supervised until they get onto their buses.
- Students in “After School Care” are supervised until 5:30pm or until they are collected.
- The only students allowed to play on our grounds after 3:15pm are children booked into After School Care or students accompanied by an adult.

*Please note that a student's family are expected to take overall responsibility for a student before they arrive at school and after they leave. Older students who are trusted by their families to make their own choices and decisions will take on their own responsibility.*

### REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES

We record daily student attendance electronically. Part of recording absences involves the teacher recording the reason for a student's absence. **For this reason, we ask that when you call school about an absence, please state clearly whether your child is sick or is away for another reason e.g. special family occasion, medical appointment, family holiday etc.** The electronic system records absences as either justified or unjustified. The Ministry of Education expects us to follow up with individual families involved, frequent unjustified absences or frequent lateness or patterns of attendance causing concern.

### HIGHLIGHTER VESTS

A reminder to all families using school buses that it is compulsory for children to wear a highlighter vest on the bus at all times. Vests can be purchased from Metrografix. Please ensure your child's vest is clearly named. A number of children have not been wearing vests this week. This is currently being monitored and may result in a child not being able to travel on the bus, as school health and safety procedures state that this is a requirement. We would appreciate your support with this matter.

## CYBERSAFETY – DO YOU KNOW WHAT YOUR CHILDREN ARE DOING ON THEIR DEVICES?

Staff often discusses the concerns we have about the inappropriate use of social media and we all agree that it is possibly one of the biggest challenges facing the youth of today. We are aware of a number of children who have Instagram accounts. There is plenty of information available on the internet about age restrictions for all social media sites and the reasons for this. It is generally accepted that children under the age of 13 years should not be using Facebook, Instagram and other “adult” social media sites. Children can sometimes set up accounts with parental consent, meaning parents have control over the settings for these site. There are also child appropriate social media sites available for children. **We encourage all parents to research the internet to become fully informed about the different social media sites. We also advise you to monitor the use of devices by your children.**

## COMPLAINTS TO THE SCHOOL POLICY

If you wish to contact the school about any concerns you may have please note our policy with regards to this:

- ◆ Complaints to be dealt with as soon as is practicably possible.
- ◆ For complaints dealing with pupils or staff members, the caregivers shall be encouraged to follow these steps:
  - ◆ contact the teacher.
  - ◆ contact the principal.
  - ◆ contact the Board in writing
- ◆ Where significant complaints occur the principal shall request the complaint be made in writing and recorded.
- ◆ Written complaints to the Board may be dealt with by the full Board or a subcommittee established to investigate them. The power of “in committee” procedure will be used to deal with the confidentiality of the complaint.
- ◆ The terms and conditions of a staff member shall be referred to in the event of complaint being lodged against them. (Refer collectives or IEC’s).

If you are unable to pay by internet banking, payment can be made by cash or cheque. Please place cash/cheque in a named envelope and specify what the payment is for on the envelope. The envelope can be given to the classroom teacher to come to the office in the purple bag. If dropping the envelope to the office, please put envelope in the post-it slot. **We do not have eftpos.**
- **We have limited cash, so please endeavour to pay the exact amount of cash.**
- **You can pay regular amounts to cover costs e.g \$5 per week if NE-Y2, \$10 per week if Y3&4, \$15 Y5&6.**
- Should you require assistance to meet school costs, please contact the principal or Tegan in the office as there is assistance that is available.

## AFTER-SCHOOL CARE PROGRAMME
