



SPORTS SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

This term the children have been lucky enough to participate in skills development coaching sessions with Viv Buchanan – (Hockey) and Logan (Touch Rugby). Our Physical Education Programme includes developing understanding in four key areas – personal health & physical development, movement concepts and motor skills, relationships with other people and healthy communities and environment. We place high value on our students participating in regular physical activity including daily fitness and games, building understanding of wellbeing, developing and practising a wide range of movement skills using a variety of equipment and play environments, Fair Play values and contributing positively as a team member. Our Sports Coordinators Andrew Ede and Karen Gallagher are committed to ensuring that our students have every opportunity to participate in any sports events scheduled in our region. Such events include swimming sports, triathlon, cross country, Top Bike, orienteering and athletics at a regional level and touch and school interchanges locally. Our physical education programmes encourage students to engage in movement experiences that promote and support the development of physical and social skills. It also fosters critical thinking and action that enables our students to understand the role and significance of physical activity for not only themselves, but for everyone.

SENIOR LEARNING HUB CONSTRUCTION

Please be aware that the construction of the new classrooms is about to commence. This will mean the following:

- A safety fence will be erected around the whole site which will clearly mean that the site is out of bounds both during and outside school operating hours.
- Some trees from the Junction Suite down to Austin Place may be removed during site preparation.

Parking spaces have been organised as follows:

- Monaghan Street - both sides of the street from the crossing to Ray Street will be available for drop off/pick up.
- Molyneux Ave - the area between the entrance to our school car park and the corner of Monaghan Street (school side) will be available for drop off/pick up. NO long term parking please.

- Staff have agreed to leave the above areas free for pick up/drop off and are using alternative parking spaces during the construction period.

There will be more traffic due to our construction site so please avoid:

- Double parking
- Parking on yellow lines
- Parking on the opposite side of the road to school and call your children across the busy road
- Long term parking in our pick up/drop off areas that have been created to keep everyone safe and to keep traffic flowing





HEALTH & SAFETY NEWS

- School staff has recently met with CODC Roading Engineers to discuss the possibility of erecting suitable signage for the streets on our boundary. We are hoping to have signage erected to ensure that drop off/pick up areas are used appropriately (driver remains in the car) and that as the school grows, pick up/drop off areas can cope with the increased traffic.
- The wearing of sun hats will be compulsory again in Term 4. Please ensure your child has a regulation sun hat to wear next term and that it is clearly named.
- Highlighter vests are compulsory for all students travelling on school buses.
- Last week 25 staff members completed Workplace First Aid Training. Training was either for the two year re-certification or full first aid training for first timers. This was a fantastic response from staff, all committed to ensuring that our school environment is kept safe for everyone
- A reminder about the dangers of dropping children off on the opposite side of the streets to school. Recently we have witnessed several parents dropping students off on the far side of the street and then watching them run across the road to school. This is a most unsafe practice. We provide supervised road patrols on both roads in the mornings and afternoons and we expect students needing to cross the roads, to use these unless they are accompanied by their parents when they cross.
- We also encourage all parents to cross children at the patrolled crossing we have in place on both Monaghan Street & Molyneux Avenue. It is setting a very unsafe example when adults dropping children to school, cross the street in places other than the designated crossings, especially when it is in view of the road patrols. Let's work together to keep our children safe on the roads.

FINANCES

- **GUITAR - Guitar Lesson fees will be increasing next term to \$45 per term (8 lessons minimum).**
- School Costs will be billed to your child's account. A statement will be sent out monthly that shows the items billed and payments made.
- Please pay by internet banking (03-1735-0004162-000). Please put name and what it relates to as the reference and/or e-mail Tegan to advise. If you are unable to pay by internet banking, payment can be made by cash or cheque. Please place cash/cheque in a named envelope and specify what the payment is for on the envelope. The envelope can be given to the classroom teacher to come to the office in the purple bag. If dropping the envelope to the office, please put envelope in the post-it slot. **We do not have eftpos.**
- **We have limited cash, so please endeavour to pay the exact amount of cash.**
- You can pay regular amounts to cover costs e.g \$5 per week if NE-Y2, \$10 per week if Y3&4, \$15 Y5&6.
- Should you require assistance to meet school costs, please contact the principal or Tegan in the office as there is assistance that is available.


