## PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT NEWS

We are pleased that tenders have now closed for the building project involving our four classroom senior hub and also a multipurpose building. This week the procurement team has been working through a tender evaluation process in order to determine who the main contractor will be to deliver this project. All going well, the project will get underway at the beginning of Term 3 with the completion date hopefully early in 2019.

## CROMWELL COMMUNITY OF LEARNING (COL) PROGRESS REPORT

- CoLs were introduced as part of the National Government Initiative (IES) - Investing in Educational Success. Under IES, Communities of Learning are formed, work together on identifying common achievement challenges and share expertise for addressing them. A Community of Learning, (CoL), is made up of schools and early childhood centres which, for the most part, are geographically linked. These organisations form a pathway which reflects a student's journey through the education system.
- A Community of Learning or Kāhui Ako is a group of education and/or training providers that form around children and young people's learning pathways, and work together to help them achieve their full potential.
- Participation in a CoL is voluntary, with the Ministry of Education providing additional financial, staffing and professional learning & development resourcing to support the work.
- There are now over 220 Communities of Learning across NZ.
- All the schools and preschools in Cromwell have joined together to form the Cromwell CoL - Goldfields Primary, Cromwell College, Little Wonders, Willows, Barnardos, Educare, CELCI, Kidsfirst Cromwell Kindergarten & Cromwell Primary.
- In November 2017, Wendy Brooks was appointed as the Lead Principal of the Cromwell Community of Learning. She commenced this role at the beginning of 2018 and spends two days per week undertaking work for the CoL.
- The Cromwell Community of Learning (CoL) is called *"Te Kahui Ako o nga Awanui"* the community of learning of the big rivers.
- The vision for Te Kahui Ako o nga Awanui is *"learning together to make a difference"*.
- The CoL whakatauki is *"Ko te ahurei o te akonga arahina o tatou mahi"* – let the uniqueness of the learner guide our work.
- CoL values are - Rawe (personal excellence), Manaakitanga (care and respect), Ako Whanaungatanga (learning partnerships, lifelong learning, Maia (courage), Aumanga (resilience).
- By sharing resources and professional learning and development opportunities, developing a shared understanding of effective teaching practices and ensuring children have seamless transitions from centres to schools and college, we are committed to ensuring that Cromwell students will have opportunities to achieve their best possible educational outcomes.

## SPACE EXPO

Harewa Team's Space Expo on Friday 1 June was a great success. The event was well supported by parents and grandparents. The rooms were buzzing with excitement and in-depth learning about the planet Mars was evident, particularly with the Year 2 children. The children are learning to communicate clearly with others. 

## MID YEAR STUDENT PROFILES & STUDENT LED CONFERENCES

Student profiles will be sent home at the end of next week, Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> June. This year we will be reporting in relation to expected curriculum levels because National Standards have been removed. Apart from making this change, the Mid Year Report will be the same as the 2017 format which we hope you found easy to understand and which clearly identifies exactly where your child is at with his/her learning. You will quickly be able to see areas of strength or areas where your child is below the expected level for their age or time at school. Education is a partnership and it will be very important for you to discuss the profile with your child and talk about ways you can support their progress at home. This may mean ensuring that reading practice happens every night, that spelling work is being done and words are being practised and that basic facts flash cards are being used every night to improve students' knowledge and fast recall of these. Time spent at home on these tasks really does make a difference to your child's progress and their learning. Celebrate progress, achievements and the reaching of goals set earlier in the year, and also help your child identify possible goals for the remainder of 2018. **Please bring your child's profile to their student led conference in Week 9.**



## Health & Safety News: Dogs on School Grounds

- The school has developed these procedures in response to issues we have had with dogs roaming on our grounds during school hours
- Dogs that are walked to school with parents and children must be under control (specifically on a lead).
- **Parents walking a dog when dropping off or collecting children must not enter the school grounds, but are to wait on the street with their dog.**
- No dog is to be tied to school equipment (bus shelter, playground equipment or bike stands etc) at any time.
- School signage clearly supports our "No Dogs Policy"
- School procedures and expectations linked to this procedure will be communicated to parents at least once per year.
- The school will provide "Safety Around Dogs" Education annually for all students.
- An alternative Dog Control Policy may be developed and used during special events such as Pet Day or as required.
- Wandering dogs will be detained, contact will be made with owners if possible, the dog will be impounded on second incident, unidentifiable dogs will be impounded immediately.
- Dog bites – child's parents contacted immediately, first aid administered, usually followed by a visit to the Medical Centre. Dog Control Officer contacted & dog impounded. Dog Control Officer will deal with the owner and dog as per dog bylaws.

It is important that children know what to do when they come across an unfamiliar dog or simply how to be safe around dogs at home. Not all dogs are friendly, some can be dangerous to children. **It is important your children know not to approach a dog unless they get permission from the owner (adult).**



## STUDENTS REQUESTING TO TRAVEL ON THE SCHOOL BUSES

We are frequently asked for non-eligible students to travel on the School Buses before or after school.

I have discussed this type of use of school buses with the bus company and re-read the rules from the Ministry of Education and the following is the stance that schools must follow. The Ministry of Education is clear in its regulations regarding the use of school buses by ineligible students. They are **not** entitled to travel on a school bus and if there was to be any type of accident or incident the bus company would lose their contract and the manager his job. Therefore please do not request for your child to use a school bus for transport as we cannot allow this to happen and it will be met with a refusal.


