## Hārewa 2

This term Hārewa 2 and the junior teaching team are bringing a new teaching philosophy and practice into their classrooms; learning through play. Research provides evidence that play is the most valuable and successful way in which children engage in learning. Through play children create a learning environment of their own where they are engaged, able to feed their curiosity and given the freedom to explore together.



Exploring physics and forces, motor cognition, problem solving, setting challenges, making connections, reflecting.

"Play is often talked about as if it were a relief from serious learning but for children, play is serious learning."

You may have noticed that in Hārewa 2 and other junior classes there is a growing collection of loose parts, or "stuff" that the children are encouraged to play and create with. These resources have been specifically introduced to cater for the behaviours children have exhibited within their

play based environments. Studies show that when children are exposed to resources that cater for their schema (urges) and allow no limitations to their imaginations they are engaging in higher order socio-imaginative play.



Construction, technology, communication, collaboration, problem solving, measurement.

Through imaginative play children are developing their ability to think critically and creatively, to problem solve, communicate their ideas effectively and develop their higher order cognitive skills.

In Hārewa 2 it is already evident the positive impact learning through play is having on the children. Children are discovering new friendships,

communicating together effectively, exploring new interests, there are increasing levels of engagement in learning tasks, and the children appear more driven and motivated.

The children are enjoying their new learning environment, the challenges it presents and the places it is taking them through imaginative play.

## TEACHERS STRIKE ACTION WEDNESDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST - SCHOOL CLOSED

### ***What we are campaigning for?***

- **More teachers – so your children can get more attention.**
- **More resources/staff to support children with additional learning needs.**
- **A pay jolt to salaries for teachers to address the teacher shortage – so that your children will have a teacher in the future**

Teachers have voted to take strike action for a full day on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> August. Teachers and principals are determined to send a strong message to the Government and demand change so our students can have a teacher in every classroom, the learning support they need and teachers are recognised as the professionals they are.

Both primary teachers and principals feel the Ministry's June offers did not address workload issues, extra learning support or ways to stem the growing crisis in recruiting and retraining teachers. Teachers are available for a chat about the campaign directly after school tomorrow.

Dear Parents and Caregivers

The Board of Trustees can't provide teaching for students during the upcoming strike.

The NZEI has advised the Cromwell Primary School Board of Trustees that the Principal, Wendy Brooks and teachers at our school will be taking strike action on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> August from 7am to 7pm.

The Board has carefully considered the availability of teaching staff, and unfortunately decided that we can't provide the normal teaching services during the strike. It's important that you can make alternative arrangements for the care of your child/children on the day of the strike.

All teachers and the principal are on strike so no supervision can be provided. The school will need to close during this strike. I know that this is inconvenient for parents and students alike, but please be assured that student safety is our main concern.

## CROMWELL COMMUNITY OF LEARNING UPDATE – TE KĀHUI AKO O NGĀ AWANUI

1. Our Community of Learning (CoL) has now completed the first six months of working together and we have been working hard to build our understanding of what working collaboratively will look like in our CoL.
2. Our CoL consists of Cromwell College, Goldfields Primary, Willows, Barnardos, Cromwell Kidsfirst Kindergarten, Little Wonders, CELCI, Educare and Cromwell Primary School.
3. Mary Ann Baxter was appointed as our Expert Partner and the Lead Principal is Wendy Brooks.
4. The Establishment Management Team meets twice per term at CELCI.
5. Different community members are being invited to attend meetings to share how they may support the work of our CoL in the future. An example of this was participation in a Cromwell Master Plan Workshop with the CODC.
6. We organised a Restorative Practice Parent Education Forum in Term One.
7. We are currently working on developing our achievement challenges with our first challenge being set around wellbeing. All Years 5-10 students across the three schools have completed an online Wellbeing Survey and all preschools have undertaken group surveys, with 2-4 year olds, responding to simple questions linked to wellbeing.
8. New Entrant teachers have been working with 4 year olds in the preschools gathering oral language baseline data.
9. We have established a CoL ICT Leadership Team who have worked collaboratively to plan a professional learning and development programme for teachers around the new Digital Technologies Curriculum. As the Lead School, Cromwell Primary has also led the completion of a funding application to the Otago Community Trust that would enable us to purchase the equipment and resources we will need to fully implement the new technology curriculum.
10. We are currently planning a Family Health Forum that will be offered to support our families cope with the many health issues that may affect children and young people as they are growing up. This will be a one-off event held before the end of Term 3. At this evening forum we will also launch our CoL Health & Wellbeing Overview Statement that will provide clarity for our community around how we respond to various health issues.

## HEALTH & SAFETY NEWS

Winter illnesses continue to take their toll this term, with daily attendance numbers for students being affected. We have appreciated the support of parents who have kept sick children at home, including those displaying possible flu like symptoms. When sick children are kept away from school, it ensures that school continues as usual for those students who are well. Southern District Health Board Medical Officer of Health Dr Reid said “this may mean that children are home for several days. Schools were not places where sick children should be looked after. Personal hygiene was the community’s best defence against sickness and this included washing hands using soap and water and drying thoroughly, catching sneezes in tissues and binning them and keeping away from others if you are unwell. We remind all parents of the following:

- Please keep the contact information you provide the school with up to date (current phone contact numbers and email address).
- You must contact the school every day your child is absent from school. The school must account for every child, every day
- When leaving a message or sending an email please state the reason for your child’s absence e.g. medical or other.
