Last week I was in Melbourne attending the National Future Schools Conference, an experience designed to “make a difference”. I was able to tailor my own learning experiences by choosing from five conferences with multiple streams consisting of leadership for the future, teaching about and using emerging technologies, inclusive education with no child left behind, the young learners’ perspective of holistic and technological teaching and learning and preparing teachers for the new digital technologies curriculum including coding and robotics. We have a wonderful opportunity as a new Community of Learning, to engage in future focussed thinking and to start taking action by being brave and taking those first steps of transformational change. Now is our time to be curious. It is a time to disrupt, connect together to create an inspiring Cromwell Community.

## CURRICULUM CORNER: RESTORATIVE PRACTICE AT SCHOOL

With our recent professional learning with Margaret Thorsborne, we are continuing to strengthen our knowledge and understanding of the process that we use at school to help resolve situations of conflict. International research confirms that punitive methods of behaviour management are not effective and do not help to build lifelong learning skills that are our school's vision. We know that by supporting our students to develop self-management skills in their early years, we are giving them the tools that will help them more successfully navigate challenges they will face throughout their lives.

### **Conversations at home using restorative problem solving.**

1. Makes sure you and your child are calm.
2. Take the time to establish the facts – try to get a bit of a timeline (who did what, when).
3. Remember that it's about the harm done to people (Mum, Dad, brother, sister) rather than the broken rule that is most important.
4. Rules are about taking turns and not interrupting.

### **What to say to the person responsible**

- Tells us what happened?
- What were you thinking when you.... or what were you hoping would happen, what was the purpose of doing that, what were you wanting?
- How do you think this has affected....?

### **What to say to the person affected**

- What did you think when that happened to you?
- What is it like? How has it been for you?
- What's been the worst part of it?
- What needs to happen to fix things for you?

### **To the person responsible**

- How does that sound? Could you do that? Do you have any ideas about how to fix things?
- Help the negotiations and settle on a plan. Check up later to make sure that they are keeping their promises.
- Remember the ration of 5:1. **Connection before correction!!**

### WEB STEPS - AVAILABLE TO YOUR CHILD

Steps is an internationally recognised programme which is used in over 700 schools throughout New Zealand. Steps is a research based literacy programme. It is non age specific, which means anyone regardless of age and ability can be catered for.

Aims of the programme are to strengthen:

- letter/sound correspondence
- Processing skills with sounds and sound patterns
- Rapid whole word recognition
- Spelling accuracy

You can purchase Web Steps yourself online for your child. However, Learning Staircase who manage the Steps programme provide a less expensive option through your child's school. We can register your child for Web Steps at a cost of \$15.00 per student. Websteps allows students to access the programme on any device.
