#### RESOLUTION

By COUNCIL MEMBER KELLEY:

WHEREAS, On Wednesday, the 21st day of June, 1989, the Supreme Court of the United States of America ruled by a 5-4 vote that burning an American flag is a constitutionally-protected form of free speech; and

WHEREAS, The American flag since its adoption on June 14th, 1777 has symbolized the ideals of freedom, independence and unity for which millions of Americans have suffered and died to defend; and

WHEREAS, The burning or the defacement of the American Flag is a symbolic destruction of the ideals and the constitutional foundation upon which the government of these United States stands and rightfully deserves lasting respect and protection from willful harm; and

WHEREAS, This decision by the Supreme Court has gravely affected the spirit of the American people and cannot be silently accepted by those who believe that our treasured freedom of speech does not permit a deliberate assault upon the American flag. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, That the Detroit City Council joins with countless other Americans in expressing profound disappointment in this action by the majority of the Supreme Court Justices; AND BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED, That the Detroit City Council supports the consideration of a Constitutional Amendment by Congress to ban flag desecrations; AND BE IT FINALLY

RESOLVED, That copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Honorable Justices of the United States Supreme Court and the Honorable members of the Michigan Congressional Delegation.
