France − CNDS

- A part of the lotteries and sports betting stakes is paid to the <u>National Agency for the Development of Sport (CNDS)</u> (EUR 4,5 bn since 1985).
- CNDS is a public body whose mission consists in promoting access to grass roots sports and contributing to the construction or renovation of sports facilities.
- In 2013, more than EUR 230 million were allocated to the CNDS, i.e 80% of its overall budget.



FOR THE BENEFIT OF SOCIETY

- OPAP S.A. is traditionally the grand sponsor of all sports
- finances the participation of school delegations to international school events
- Supports sports festivals for primary and secondary schools in numerous regions of Greece
- Grand Sponsor of the Athens "Classic" Marathon

- New programme "Sport Blossoms" for encouraging children to take part in sports activities
- supporting a project with the goal to encourage female sport activities
- 1 bn EUR to the strategic national programme for constructing sports facilities all over the country



- <u>BULGARIA</u>: 17 % of the Lottery's turnover in every drawing goes for the benefit of all licensed sports federations under their principal the Ministry of Physical education and Sports (MPES).
- SLOVENIA: significant annual contribution to the Slovenian Sports Foundation (EURO 8.920.747) by the 2 Slovenian Lotteries. This money is allocated to various sports clubs, unions and associations and more than 500 sport programmes.
- <u>BELARUS</u>: Sport-Pari, according to its Charter, allocates up to
 69% of its profit to the support and the development of sport in
 Belarus.





- GERMANY: Lotto-Bayern contributes around 400 million Euros to the state budget (of which a big part is allocated to culture and sport)
- In NORWAY, punters have the possibility to contribute directly to grassroots sport by offering 5% of the stake to the sport activity/organisation they would like to support / (50 million Euros allocated to grassroots sport in 2013)
- ✓ In <u>POLAND</u>, 25% of the lottery ticket price, and 10% of every raffle ticket price is being used for good causes and sport – around 1.53 million PLN (around 365,000 EUR) to support the local sport per day!

Supporting the Olympic movement & Promoting Olympic Values



- Switzerland 65% of the NOC's budget comes from <u>Loterie Romande</u> and <u>SWISSLOS</u>
- In <u>Italy</u>, part of the revenue of EL's Members <u>Lottomatica</u> and <u>Sisal</u> is allocated to CONI, the National Olympic Committee
- In Norway, Norsk Tipping is supporting the Youth Winter Olympic Games 2014 in Lillehammer

Promoting Diversity & Disability Sport



- UK: Camelot main funder of 2012 Paralympics
- Austria: Austrian Lotteries offered around 900,000 Euros to Austrian Paralympic Committee, since 1996
- Germany: Lotto-Toto GmbH Sachsen-Anhalt has supported "Special Olympics" athletes in 2013, regional sport games for people with disabilities and their friends in 2014 as well as the Wheelchair sports festival in 2014

Spain: ONCE has contributed to the creation of the SPANISH FEDERATION OF BLIND SPORTS (FEDC) in 1993 and since then is its main funder. ONCE is also a huge supporter of disability sports in Spain through supporting the Paralympic Committee and numerous disability sports federation.
