Revive & Restore Housing Assistance Program

The purpose of the Housing Assistance program through the Department of Corrections (DOC) is to assist individuals who have been released on parole to obtain and maintain safe and affordable housing. This is accomplished by providing case management and wrap around services for two years. During the two-year period, based on income eligibility, participants receive rental assistance for a six-month period and ongoing intensive case management services for two years from the date of enrollment into the program. During the time enrolled in the program participants will be supported with the following:

- SA total of six months paid rent (which includes first and last month's rent and security deposit)
- Establishing/maintaining a bank account and savings
- Managing a budget
- Building/repairing credit
- Mentoring program
- Educational Enhancement
- Workforce Development Opportunities
- Community connections and resources
- Supportive services and monthly monitoring (more if needed)
- Collaboration with State Parole
- Home Ownership Opportunities

Enrollment criteria:

- Supervised by State Parole (eligible through MAX date only)
- Income/Income potential
- Income verification reflecting 6-8 weeks' documented income
- State issued phot ID, Birth Certificate and Social Security Cards for all household members
- Methamphetamine or Arson related offenses not eligible
