- Dates: May 13th - July 11th 2019
- Length of training: 4 days per week for 9 weeks, 165 hours of training
- Days of training: 4 days per week- Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday (M-Th)
- Time of training: 9am-3pm
- Location: Drexel University Dornsife Center for Neighborhood Partnerships
- Cost: **FREE training, participant payment will be provided**

This program is designed to train **men, ages 18-30, who have experienced violent injury in their own lives to become Community Health Worker Peers/ Certified Peer Specialist.** Participants who complete the CHWP/CPS Training Academy may be eligible to apply for employment as a CHWP and/or CPS.

This training series, which facilitates Community Health Worker Peer and Certified Peer Specialist trainings, provides trauma-informed instruction where participants will gain skills in violence prevention/intervention, community education, health system navigation, how to approach physical health and mental health emergencies, addressing the impact of trauma, motivational interviewing, HIPAA regulations and confidentiality, mandated reporter guidelines, group facilitation skills and de-escalation techniques to help young people in Philadelphia who are injured by violence.
