

# NeuroResource Facilitation for Marginalized and Underserved Individuals with Acquired Brain Injury

*Education, Advocacy, and Empowerment*

NeuroResource Facilitation is the process of linking persons with traumatic brain injury (TBI) to services and resources to support their rehabilitation. Our goal is to assist other professionals, specifically those working with persons who are marginalized and underserved in the identification of persons with TBI and to connect those individuals to additional funding and treatment.

There are two goals of the NeuroResource Facilitation project:

- Train agency staff about traumatic brain injury in marginalized and underserved populations. This includes why these agencies should be screening for TBI, how to screen for TBI, and what to do once an individual is identified as having a TBI.
- Provide support to staff and their clients in applying for resources to fund TBI rehabilitation.

## Educational Presentations

Presentations will cover several relevant topics. Information about the prevalence of TBI and how TBI impacts and increases the vulnerability of their respective populations will be discussed. Attendees will receive training on the use of a TBI screening tool. Available funding for rehabilitation after TBI will be reviewed, including eligibility requirements and what services each resource provides. Attendees will receive fact sheets on these resources.

## NeuroResource Facilitation Clinics

Our staff can travel to community based sites or individuals can be seen at our MossRehab Philadelphia location, which is easily accessible to public transportation. Our staff are available to complete screenings for TBI and assist in the application process for TBI funding and treatment, including documentation, form completion, and referrals.
