

BrixFest vs Single Use Plastics

This year, BrixFest is joining the fight against single use plastics. You can help us make a difference to our environment!

Here's what we've changed in 2019 to help eliminate single use plastics at our festival:

- We've issued a BAN on single use plastics from our food, arts, and craft stalls.
- That includes BAYS Brewery, who will be serving your pints in re-usable cups. Yes, that means you'll
 need to pay a small holding deposit but you'll get this back upon the safe return of your cup.
- Eliminated use of single-use cable ties in our signage in favour of re-usable clips
- Signed up a number of shops, cafes and restaurants who will allow visitors to fill up their water bottle for free (info in this brochure).
- No plastic bottles used by BrixFest volunteers or partners. Canned water available where neccesary.
- Recyclable bin bags used to collect waste
- Increased awareness to all visitors about plastic waste
- Our firework display now uses angled, larger, high-impact shells, meaning debris lands further away from the sea inland and can be cleaned up more easily
- 'BrixBags' initiative launched! Local people have made shopping bags from recyclable materials. The bags have been distributed for free in advance of the festival (and will continue to be afterwards)
- The new Kid's Day project recycles used fish and chip boxes to create a provocative sculpture encouraging visitors and locals to recycle more

The Heritage Sailing Regatta

Saturday 25th & Sunday 26th May

Brixham Heritage Sailing Regatta has its roots in the Sailing Trawler races held since the early 1800s when Brixham was the hub of boat building and sailing expertise.

Nowadays the Regatta is a showcase for classic boats of all sizes including the beautiful Brixham Trawlers, Looe Luggers, working boats, leisure craft and dinghies and this year will include a sizeable fleet of Junk Rigged boats as part of their Annual Rally. It is a get together of boats from all over the West Country and Brittany.

TRADITION

Trophies include the King George V Challenge Cup, presented by the King, in perpetuity, in recognition of the outstanding sailing skills of the Brixham trawlermen, a tradition which proudly continues to the present day in our fishing fleet.

WHAT TO SEE?

From 23rd May - The Heritage Pontoon (opposite the King William pub) is open to members of the public. Come and take beautiful pictures and chat to the crews.

26th May - 1130:

Parade of Sail off the Breakwater.

1245: The Regatta is led off by the large sailing trawlers and continues around Torbay for about 3 hours. The best view points are from the Breakwater and Battery Gardens.

All about BrixFest

8 years old and still getting bigger and better

BrixFest began in 2011 when a group of local business people and volunteers gathered together in a bid to continue the old Brixham Heritage Festival.

At the first meeting a large group discussed the details and it was decided that 'BrixFest' would become a brand new, annual, free family festival held throughout the town. The traditional grand fireworks display is the one





part of the Brixham Heritage Festival that truly stuck. Who doesn't love fireworks?

With a couple of hundred quid and small grants from Brixham Town Council and Brixham Chamber of Commerce, BrixFest was born. The first weekend of events in 2012 was an overwhelming success and since then BrixFest has grown from strength to strength.

BrixFest 2018 was, yet again, well attended and, despite a stormy weather forecast, was another big success.




