Qualified high school students (Freshman – Senior) interested in government, politics, communications or community service may build their resume for college applications, earn class credit or fulfill community service requirements for graduation by volunteering on Election Day. Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts, working toward their Eagle and Gold awards, may also be able to fulfill some of their merit badge requirements by participating in the PWC Student Election Page Program.

Duties on Election Day

1. Greet and direct voters to the check in station
2. Be sure voters have their photo ID ready to check in
3. Be aware of senior citizens and disabled voters in line and offer assistance
4. Help keep the polling area free of campaign literature
5. Make sure there are enough marking pens available in each polling station
6. Open the doors for voters and direct voters to the exits
7. Alert the Chief Election Officer of any problems with the building or voters
