Soil is often something we take for granted. Soil spends its life being trodden on, cultivated, moved, and forgotten about. Despite this, soil hosts over a quarter of our planet's biodiversity, and is the basis for more than 95% of our food production. It also has the potential to fight climate change through its ability to capture and store carbon, and currently has the ability to sequester more carbon annually than what the global transportation sector emits. With almost half of the Northern Territory utilised for food production, the management of our soils is imperative to our environmental, economic, and social future.

Territory Natural Resource Management is committed to working with those who manage soil. Through the NT Soil Consortium, TNRM brings together soil experts, researchers, land managers, and all community members to enhance understanding of soil.

To date, TNRM has worked with over 154 individuals to increase understanding and appreciation of soils, and supports farmers with the tools and knowledge they require to manage soil in a more sustainable and regenerative manner.
