Well, what do you know! NOT whoa but GO! Although the WCA is not part of the regionally organized Soapbox Race, qualifier organizations have been at Wellesley and New Dundee events in the past; we honor a past and a pastime -- a tradition of parental involvement in what is, fundamentally, a kid's activity. We've had great turnouts with photographers, the police, student volunteers, street resident audience, newcomers and old-timers all.

So, if you're in that interest group, set aside Saturday June 16th from 8:30 to Noon and join us! Please remember when planning construction that WCA has some rules about your racer.

Wheels must be rubber or rubberized, not of plastic composition, Brakes are mandatory and will be inspected (by amateurs with some experience) for full functionality, Helmets are mandatory and other protective gear (e.g. knee and elbow pads) highly recommended.

You must read, understand and sign a Liability Waiver to participate (yes, we've had a broken collarbone and various scrapes and bruises in the past – generally indicates it's a great race.) Race heats for practice start early and racing (by pairs) will start by 9:30-10 am (TBA more details will be posted

on street signage and Facebook).





Earth Day

Westvale is likely in the grip of change - according to many if not all expert climatologists – like the rest of the planet. Short-term human impact on the Earth’s resources has been considerable within the established planetary long-term climate cycles that have given us both ice ages as well as vast seas covering the interior of North America and other parts of the world. Life has adapted to change in the past; so what does our future hold?

One of the more direct consequences of climate change is thought to be the accelerated encroachment of invasive species, or at least biological representatives that do not normally reside in Westvale (European Buckthorn, Garlic Mustard and Giant Hogweed among others). They are Earth’s creatures and fight for survival like the rest of the wild world. However, they displace other species in competition for scarce resources, species that have surrounded us as part of our comfortable environment. Earth Day seeks to recognize and educate folks about Stewardship for the Land, the Air and the Water – and the Life so evolutionarily dependent on those

resources. We are frequently challenged by media presenters like David Suzuki and David Attenborough to respond in a meaningful way to direct change appropriately; so what can we as individuals do? The Japanese have a wonderful term for the employment of small process changes to improve things – “Kaizen”- normally used in a business sense about production. We as residents can adopt the same philosophy with regard to our surroundings and Earth Day gives us that opportunity to start and then to continue the effort throughout our year.

Join us this spring on Sunday, April 22nd at Holy Rosary School where the WCA will coordinate a Neighbourhood Cleanup and where you are welcome to share your environmental concerns. We’ll have a day (or even just an hour) to work to clean-up our neighbourhood as a Westvale team!



Nature challenge

A City Nature Challenge is occurring for 2018 in cities across the world for a little competition on local urban natural elements. Which city has the most nature? The City Nature Challenge 2018 will help us find out! More than 60 cities in 17 countries around the world are **asking people to explore nature in their urban areas and document the species they find**. Help Waterloo Region show the world **how biodiverse our region is** by making as many observations of as many species as possible April 27-30! Any observation of plants and animals and fungi you find in Waterloo, Kitchener, Cambridge, Wellesley, Woolwich, Wilmot, and North Dumfries will qualify.

The City of Waterloo will be hosting an activity at Millen Woodlot on April 20th from 6pm to 7pm 2018. Staff will provide training for the inaturalist app used for this challenge and will assist in a nature walk to gather observations. I am committed to finding ways to make Westvale and Waterloo a better place for your kids and my kids to live and grow up.




Fraud is a serious and costly problem where you rarely get your money back.

Be vigilant. Fraudsters are everywhere !! They are on the phone or online or at the door. 1st Rule to remember - If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!!! 2nd Rule - The government or a valid business will **never** demand that you pay an outstanding bill with gift card purchases immediately. They will **never** tell you to not discuss your conversation with them with anyone. Do not post your information to unknown or insecure sites online. If a company sends you an email requesting personal information to confirm or update your account, do NOT provide that information in a return email. Call that company via a phone number that you verify and speak with a customer service representative. Legitimate companies will **never** request any form of personal information in an email. If someone offers you something free for a small fee (comparatively speaking) ignore it, it is a scam. Never leave any personal identification or bank cards in a vehicle. Every night thieves break into cars looking for wallets and purses. Your personal information is the current currency of drug dealers and con artists.

Be smart– Protect yourself!! Together we can un-employ the thieves one opportunity at a time!!

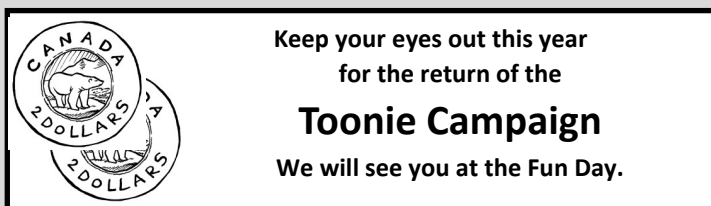

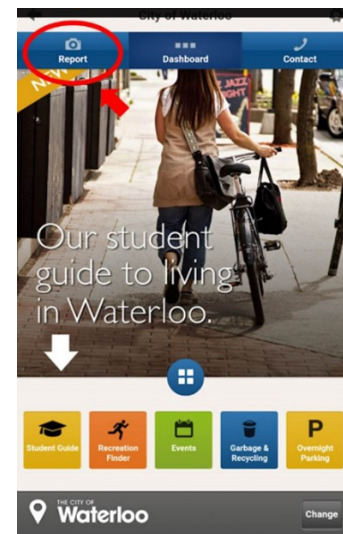


Graffiti in Westvale

Have you seen graffiti in Westvale and wondered what you can do about it?

There are two ways you can report graffiti. You can report it through the City of Waterloo website <http://www.waterloo.ca/en/government/graffiti.asp>. Or, you can download the “Pingstreet” app (<http://www.waterloo.ca/en/eservices/pingstreet>) on your phone. Choose “Report” and then “Report a Problem”. From there you can take a picture of the graffiti and send along your report directly to the City of Waterloo. This is a cool app to check out for other things too.
