This seminar will explore the physiological and psychological components of performing: factors that help – and impede – our abilities to express ourselves musically. Drawing from Lt. Col. Dave Grossman's extensive research into the effects of stress in military combat, we will explore the kinds of stress factors at work in our bodies, minds, and environments, that affect us on stage and in auditions. We will also outline methods of training and practice we can employ to overcome these inevitable stress responses so that we are able to stand in front of people and play.
