Communications: Dennie Warren – Paul has sent the May newsletter but it didn't go through on YahooGroups. Paul will resend. In addition, future newsletters will contact FWSA trip flyers.

Website: **Cathy Wilson** – Cathy will update the group email list.

Communities: Harry Davis – At the Convention, look for the Far West Ski Foundation, which has prizes at auction.

Membership: Cathy Wilson – Benelia Terry was elected to Membership Director, effective May 21. Cathy and Benelia are coordinating information.

Treasurer: **Keith Wilson** – no report.

Travel: Cathy Wilson reported for Gail Burns

(1) The FWSA 2019 Ski Week is February 2-9, 2019 to Steamboat. Cathy reported that BAC has 80 pillows in 2 lodging options allocated to BAC travelers. Gail is working on a flyer to distribute to clubs. Deposits of \$200 each traveler will be accepted on May 22. Clubs should notify their members of that date. The Lodge is priced at \$1105, and the Dulany at the Gondo-

la is priced at \$1305. All lodging options are condos, 3 BR and 3 bath, or 2 BR and 2 bath. FWSA is offering lift tickets to those travelers without an IKON pass (\$335 for five days; \$381 for six days). Check details on the upcoming flyer.

- (4) The FWSA website lists travel opportunities

Industry Liaison: Norm Glickman – Norm has included a report in the newsletter.

- (1) The main concern now is for younger skiers who are skiing in the back country in an effort to avoid the high ticket costs. Norm has read several news articles with more details about this practice.
- (2) Norm noted that National Ski Areas Assoc (NSAA) has an Industry Awards program. The Overall Safety Award was won by Mammoth Mountain. The Best Employee Safety Program was awarded to Squaw/Alpine.
- (3) SKI magazine joined NSAA and created Golden Eagle Awards. This year, Bear Valley was awarded the Golden Eagle Innovation in Sustainability award. The Golden Eagle Environmental Excellence Award went to Boreal.
- (4) Both Vail Resorts and the IKON Pass have introduced a veterans' category of cost savings.
- (5) Norm announced that he will be including some skiing Benefits in his reports.

Racing: The 2018/2019 schedule will be posted in the fall of 2018.

Our BAC 2019 FWSA Ski Week to Steamboat Springs from February 2 – 9, 2019 has been accepting sign-ups since March 22nd. Over 45+ proactive skiers have already sent in their \$200 deposit to reserve their spot to ski at one of the biggest and best tree-skiing resorts in the country! The Dulany at the Gondola Ski-In/Walk Out condos spaces were scooped up within the first 2 weeks by June 1st. The Lodge at Steamboat is available for 35 more BAC skiers with 2 bedroom condos and two 3 bedroom condo accommodations. It is only a few blocks from the base of Steamboat and is serviced by a complimentary Ski shuttle. Each condo features fully equipped kitchens, gas fireplaces, four hot tubs, free Wifi and convenient ski lockers/storage.

For those non-skiers and skiers alike, Steamboat Springs offers a rich array of optional activities: sleigh rides; mountain roller coaster; local hot springs; spa services; guided snowshoe tours; night tubing at Howelsen Hill; ice skating; dog sledding and cross-country skiing. During our BAC Ski Week to Banff, dog-sledding at 10,000 feet with our self-driven team of great dogs was a highlight!

Please go to our ski.bac.org for the Trip Preference Sheet and other required forms. You can be placed on a waiting list for the Dulany at the Gondola in case we can secure more condos there. The new IKON pass can be used at Steamboat and skiers that purchase through Sports America will get a \$30-50 discount off their lodging. The IKON pass is also good for the upcoming Mini-Ski Week at Winter Park this

March 24-19th, 2019.

(Government Camp, OR). Arapahoe Basin, CO will be closed by the time you get your hands on this newsletter. **From Government Camp, OR:** Summer Ski Season has started at Mt

Hood, Oregon! And with it comes the *30th Annual BOOSTER Summer Fun National Races* on the weekend of July 13-14-15, 2018. Online registration is now open at:

"www.SummerFunNationals.com." If you plan to go, registration for these fun races must be done online by 3 pm Friday, July 13, 2018. Onsite registration is not available. And, that means you cannot simply walk up and sign up to race each day. The website will answer many questions and provides a complete schedule of events. It also provides information about lodging and race camp options.

Check-in and a Welcome Party are both on Friday, July 13, 3:00 pm at a location to be announced (on the website) in Government Camp, OR.

- 1. **RACERS MUST HAVE completed** their Online Registration including payment of all fees ONLINE and at skiracereg.com prior to checkin.
- 2. RACERS MUST PRESENT a signed, printed TIMBERLINE LODGE & SKI AREA AGREE-

MENT OF RELEASE AND INDEMNITY. Timberline releases are online only. Follow directions on their page. When I last checked, it was not yet online.

- 3. RACERS MUST BE A 2019 USSA member to participate in this event. Click this link for membership options: https://my.ussa.org/membership/start A separate membership fee, which can be paid online, will be required. You will be asked to choose one of the following membership options:
- a. **Become a new Member:** Choose this option if you do not have a recent USSA membership.
- b. **Renew a Membership:** Choose this option if you are renewing your 2018 membership.
- c. Apply for a Temporary (one-time use) Membership: Use this option if you only want to enter this race.

The weekend finale on Sunday will be a combined awards and pool party immediately following the final race and will be over by 2:30pm, leaving time to catch a plane for home from PDX.

Many racers show up early for a few days race training at a camp to warm their legs up for the race, while others just show up and race. The Timberline Lodge and Ski Area, Government Camp, OR is a racer's Summer paradise to check out next season's ski and snowboard equipment, since many equipment and outerwear manufacturers/dealers are onsite during the summer ski/snowboard season.

The National Ski Area Association (NSAA) is the trade association for ski area owners & operators in the U.S. It represents 303 alpine resorts that account for more than 90 percent of the skier/snowboarder visits nationwide. Additionally, it has 336 supplier members who provide equipment, goods and services to the mountain resort industry. NSAA analyzes and distributes ski industry statistics; produces annual conferences and tradeshows; produces a bimonthly industry publication and is active in state and federal government affairs. The association also provides educational programs and employee training materials on industry issues

including OSHA, ADA and NEPA regulations and compliance; environmental laws and regulations; state regulatory requirements; aerial tramway safety; and resort operations and guest services. The Association's primary objective is to meet the needs of ski area owners and operators nationwide and to foster, stimulate and promote growth in the industry.

NSAA has given seven ski areas nationwide top honors for their 2017-18 marketing programs that ultimately help grow the sports of skiing and snowboarding. Squaw Valley/Alpine Meadows, California was one of the seven winning resorts: "For its Best Use of Mobile **Technology.**" The awards are sponsored by Inntopia, a strategic marketing, commerce, and business intelligence firm based in Stowe, VT. An in-depth review of the winning marketing award programs will be included in the summer issue of the NSAA Journal. NSAA also announced 2017-18 Safety Award Winners at its National Convention and Trade Show on May 5. 2018. The awards, sponsored by **Safehold** Special Risk, recognize exceptional resort initiatives to educate quests and employees about skiing and snowboarding responsibly. Two California resorts were award winners: Mammoth Mountain, for "Best Overall Safety Program" (500,000 or more visits)" and Squaw Valley/ Alpine Meadows (its second award) for "Best Employee Safety Program." Plus, The California Ski Industry Association was the winner of the "Safety Impact Award." The winning programs will be highlighted in the summer issue of the NSAA Journal.

The Mountain High Resort in Southern California earned an annual Sustainable Slopes Grant of five high-efficiency snowmaking guns from HKD Snowmakers, a total value of \$23,000. Mountain High will use this grant to reduce diesel fuel and electricity consumption. They estimate that the new equipment will save \$4,000 per acre foot of snow. Since its inception in 2009, the Sustainable Slopes Grant Program has awarded \$128,500 in cash grants and \$394,500 in in-kind grants, for a total of \$523,000 in support of resort sustainability projects.

SKI Magazine has honored three ski areas— Bear Valley Mountain, CA; Crystal Mountain,

MI, and Boreal Mountain, CA—with the 2018 Golden Eagle Awards. These awards are viewed as a partnership between SKI and the National Ski Areas Association and is considered the ski industry's most prestigious honors for recognizing a resort's environmental initiatives. 2018 marks the 25th anniversary of these awards. New this year, the Climate Change Impact Award went to Crystal Mountain for its leadership on climate change advocacy and action. Boreal Mountain earned the 2018 Golden Eagle Award for **Environmental Excellence** for its Tahoe Solar Initiative by reducing 790 tons of carbon annually since 2008. Boreal offsets 100 percent of its energy use with RECs (renewable -energy-certificates), and most recently installed 715 solar panels on its Woodward Tahoe facility. As Boreal and Woodward Tahoe are youthcentric brands, the resort's outreach and branding of this "Tahoe Solar" project is helping influence younger generations on their role in sustainability. (visit www.rideboreal.com) Also new this year is Golden Eagle's Innovation in Sustainability Award which was awarded to Bear Valley Mountain for its renewable energypowered "eco-glamping" experience for guests in canvas tents overlooking the Mokelumne River Canyon on National Forest lands. Each tent was equipped with an off-grid Nature Power 1800 watt solar and wind energy-generating system to power CFL lamps, recharge cell phones, and power lighting in portable restrooms. may be the answer. Mount Hood summer camps provide instruction in ski racing, moguls, free skiing, snowboard freeride and snowboard racing. The sessions are a week-long with the main business taking place during June, July, and August. Camp arrival day is on a Sunday. On-mountain training takes place Monday thru Friday, and departure day is on Saturday. Roughly 40% of campers stay more than one session. All on the snow training takes place on the Palmer Glacier at Timberline Lodge and ski Area, Government Camp, Oregon. During time at camp, coaches help campers improve skiing or snowboarding skills by teaching the fundamentals and correct technique required for success. Goals will be established and assessed, and a safe progression will be planned to achieve the best results. All coaches have strong coaching and skiing/snowboarding backgrounds and are passionate about their sport. On-hill video combined with proven training progressions, allows MHSSC to maximize learning and skill acquisition. When the lifts close for the day the afternoon program begins. Campers pick one activity each day from a host of activities including: white water rafting, rock climbing, challenge courses, trampoline, frisbee, golf, paintball, hiking etc. After activities is dinner. An evening group meeting is held after dinner, with a few evening activities, then bed time. Campers are provided everything during their stay at camp, including pick up and drop off at the Portland International Airport (PDX). Check the camp website to fill in the details (mthood.com).
