

Int'l Summit of Cooperatives

In October 2016, a delegation from the Bermuda Trade Union Congress (BTUC) attended the *Quebec 2016 International Summit of Cooperatives*. The event attracted more than 2,500 participants from 93 countries, bringing together managers, decision-makers and leaders of cooperatives and mutual enterprises of all sizes and from all sectors. This summit provided a unique venue for reflection, discussion, cooperation and training on major trends, and current and future economic and financial issues.

Caribbean Congress of Labour (CLC)

In October 2016, President Jason Hayward, 1st VP Bro Wendell Hayward and General Secretary Bro Ed Ball Jr attended the CCL 19th Triennial Delegates Congress in Antiqua. The theme of this conference was "Strengthening CCL in the Struggle for Workers' Rights & Freedoms in the Changing Global Environment."







In preparation for the upcoming Government CBA negotiations, President Jason Hayward and members of the Executive, held meetings with Divisional representatives and Shop Stewards to outline BPSU's collaborative approach to the negotiation process.

Summary Results


In keeping with the BPSU's continued commitment to open dialogue with our membership, we sought feedback from members through an online satisfaction survey conducted between August 10 -24.

The results will be used to track the membership's satisfaction levels over time and to provide information that would be used to formulate an action plan for the ongoing development of our Union.

Membership participation in our survey this year increased by an impressive 33% over last year's survey. Representing approximately 13% of our membership, 411 persons participated in our survey this year, up from the 310 respondents recorded in 2015.

The BPSU is pleased to report that membership satisfaction levels were up notably year-over-year.

Participants indicated that they would like additional benefits including increasing the number and variety



of membership discounts, access to financing for education, wage increases, better health insurance, an increase in vacation, compassionate and sick leave, implementation of daycare for members' children, more BPSU social events, additional educational forums, financial assistance for members who are experiencing financial hardship, a BPSU co-op, etc. These recommendations will be forwarded to our Executive Committee for further consideration.

GRIEVANCE HANDLING

Similar to 2015, this year approximately 23% of those members that were surveyed had a grievance or a workplace dispute in the last 2 years.

Of these respondents, 47% were either *very satisfied* or *satisfied* with the manner in which BPSU handled their grievance or dispute, representing a 7% increase over last year.
