#### TOWN CLERK/TAX COLLECTOR - A FEW "THINGS TO KNOW"

Licensing of Dogs - Pursuant to RSA 466:1; dogs are required to be licensed every year between January 1st and April 30th. Pursuant to RSA 466:13, a forfeiture fee of \$25.00 for an unlicensed dog will be charged after April 30. The current rabies certificate is required to be presented when licensing dogs. New dogs or updating rabies certificates are required to be transacted at the Town Clerk's Office.

**Rabies Clinic** – The annual Raymond Rabies Clinic held by the Raymond Firefighters Association is in March. Please watch for the date, place, time, and cost on the Town's website, <a href="www.raymondnh.gov">www.raymondnh.gov</a> and RCTV Channel 22 or call 603-895-3321.

**Unpaid Property Taxes; Notice of Arrearage** – Pursuant to RSA 76:11-b; a summary of unpaid property taxes will be mailed in January of 2019 to the owners on record.

ADDITIONAL PAYMENT OPTION: DEBIT AND CREDIT CARDS ACCEPTED AT THE TOWN CLERK/TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE. DUE TO VISA POLICY, OVER-THE-COUNTER WATER PAYMENTS CANNOT BE MADE WITH VISA. Please note: There is a 2.79% user fee added to all debit and credit card payments over \$52.00. There is a \$1.50 user fee added to all debit and credit card payments \$52.00 and under. A municipality does not absorb user fees. Cash and checks are also accepted for payment at the Town Clerk/Tax Collector's Office.

**ONLINE SERVICES:** At <a href="https://www.raymondnh.gov">www.raymondnh.gov</a> residents may renew vehicle registrations and dog licenses, as well as, make tax and water bill payments, and acquire vital records. Credit cards are accepted as an online payment option in addition to ACH payments (extra fees apply). Also, please user fees above.

To ensure receipt of registrations by the expiration date, please take notice of the following time frame when renewing online: All online renewals have a 3-day to 5-day internal processing time, plus the mailing time. Therefore, it is advantageous to renew registrations by the middle of the month. If your registration has expired, it is recommended that you complete your renewal at the office.

**Elections:** For all Elections, voters should be aware that photo identification is required to be presented when voting in person. The voter ID Law is still in effect. Any voter who does not present an approved photo ID will be permitted to vote after having their picture taken, attaching it to the "Challenged Voter Affidavit", which has been executed by the voter. Photo identification is required to be presented when registering to vote.


