The competition consisted of an initial round consisting of a series of test questions on parliamentary procedure. These included things like the required vote for a given motion and if a motion was privileged or not..

Following testing, members were then lead into a mock meeting room where they were assigned a number and a motion which they had to make in the meeting. Members then had to demonstrate proper procedure in bringing up a given main motion as well as making sure they got their given motion in.

January 28 marked the date of the Section 14 Public Speaking CDE at New Berlin High School.

The contest consisted of three categories: Prepared Public Speaking, Extemporaneous Public Speaking, and Creed Speaking. Athens participated in the categories of Creed and Extemporaneous.

Participating in Creed Speaking was Lea Kissick and Cody Carter. Participants were required to recite the creed. Judges looked for good tone, emotion, and posture. The members were then put through a round of questions. These included topics on the general history of the creed and how its words were interpreted by them.

Competing in Extemporaneous Public Speaking was Justin Myers and Danielle Cornwell. Contestants had to give a 3-5 minute speech on a topic drawn at random. They were

judged based on their ability to give an impactful speech and for exhibiting a basic knowledge on their topic. They were then submitted to questions based on major points on their topic.

Congratulations to Danielle Cornwell and Lea Kissick for placing first in their categories! They will advance on to district on April 1st. Cody Carter placed fourth in Creed Speaking and Justin Myers placed fifth in Extemporaneous Public Speaking.
