- 6. It must provide a forum for public criticism and compromise.

- 7. It must strive to make the significant interesting and relevant.
- 8. It must keep the news comprehensive and in proportion.
- 9. Its practitioners have an obligation to exercise their personal conscience.
- 10. Citizens, too, have rights and responsibilities when it comes to the news.
