FOREIGN TRADE TURNOVER OF THE LIPETSK REGION WITH BELGIUM INCREASED BY ALMOST 40%

Foreign trade turnover of the Lipetsk region with Belgium increased for the first eight months of 2018 of 39% compared to the same period last year and amounted to 833,1 million dollars, according to the administration of the Lipetsk region.

«For several years, Belgium is among the five largest foreign trade partners of the Lipetsk region. In January-August 2018 turnover of the Lipetsk region with Belgium increased by 39% compared to the same period of the previous year and amounted to 833,1 million dollars. The exports also increased by 39% to 821,2 million dollars. The share of exports in turnover: 98,6%», — stated in the message.

According to the administration of the region, exports from the Lipetsk region in Belgium by the end of 2017 increased by 55% and amounted to 907 million dollars. The main commodity group exports steel products in small quantities exported oil products. Also increased 3.5 times the imports from Belgium reached \$ 28 million. Major commodity groups of imports in 2017 — engineering products (50%), ferrous metals (24%), chemical products (17%).

which Russian company "Molvest" from VORONEZH began breeding in 2015, the transfer of a herd of 77 cows was held in the south of Belgium near to Namur.

So called cows-bodybuilders were delivered to isolated agricultural enterprise platform "Novomarkovskoe". Due to the mutation of a gene, which affects protein, the animals have a greater muscle mass. It seems that they practised for decades in the fitness rooms.



In the regional Rosselhoznadzore (a quality control agency) confirmed that Belgian ungulates combine high fat milk with large quantities of meat.

So far, the cows are in the quarantine mode in Kantemirovskom area. This is required by the rules of the Customs Union.

The event was organized in premises of Moscow Capital Club.

Ms. Trofimova worked in Gazprombank namely as a Member of the Management Board and supervised the Ratings Advisory Centre, the Centre for Economic Forecasting and the Corporate Communications Department. On 19 October 2018 took place the meeting of Tatyana Golikova, Chairperson of the Russian part of the mixed commission, and Didier Reynders, Chairperson of the Belgian part of the Joint Commission for Economic Cooperation between Russia and the Belgian-Luxembourg Economic Union, expressed the hope that the countries will be able to raise the level of trade and economic dialogue.



The deepening of cooperation in the field of innovation, aviation, cooperation in education and science, as well as the localization of production in consumption areas will be continued.

The parties also discussed trade and economic cooperation, noting the intensity and interest in the cooperation of national business communities. According to the results of January-August 2018, the volume of Russian-Belgian trade increased by 25% compared to the same period last year.

In addition, implementation of the agreements reached during the XI session of the mixed commission on economic cooperation between Russia and the Belgian-Luxembourg Economic Union was discussed.

TWO MAJOR DEVELOPMENT BANKS AGREED ON WEDNESDAY TO COLLABORATE ON BELT AND ROAD PROJECTS OF COMMON INTEREST AND HELP ELIGIBLE COUNTRIES WITH FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Beijing-based Asia Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) and Almaty-based Eurasian Development Bank (EDB) plan to cooperate via infrastructure projects in transport, sustainable development, urban and energy sectors, in addition to consulting services, analysis, and research.

The agreement will help the banks "boost economic growth and prosperity in the region" and "enhance its internal and external connectivity in terms of trade, investment and business links" in addition to strengthening knowledge-sharing on multiple fronts such as temporary assignments and staff exchanges,

WORLD BANK GROUP FLAGSHIP REPORT "DOING BUSINESS 2019. TRAINING FOR REFORM" comparing business Regulation for Domestic Firms in 190 Economies

Doing Business 2019 is the 16th in a series of annual reports investigating the regulations that enhance business activity and those that constrain it. Doing Business presents quantitative indicators on business regulation and the protection of property rights that can be compared across 190 economies—from Afghanistan to Zimbabwe—and over time.

Regulations affecting 11 areas of the life of a business are covered: starting a business, dealing with construction permits, getting electricity, registering property, getting credit, protecting minority investors, paying taxes, trading across borders, enforcing contracts, resolving insolvency and labor market regulation. The labor market regulation data are not included in this year's ranking on the ease of doing business.

Data in Doing Business 2019 are current as of May 1, 2018. The indicators are used to analyze economic outcomes and identify what reforms of business regulation have worked, where and why.

 Starting a business. Belarus made starting a business easier by abolishing the requirement to register the book of Registry of Inspections and

allowing its purchase within six months of incorporation.

• Dealing with construction permits. Belarus made dealing with construction permits easier by streamlining the process at the one-stop shop.

Russian Federation

- Dealing with construction permits. Russia made the process of obtaining a building permit faster by reducing the time needed to obtain construction and occupancy permits. Russia also increased quality control during construction by introducing risk-based inspections. This reform applies to both Moscow and St. Petersburg.
- Getting electricity. Russia made getting electricity faster by imposing new deadlines for connection procedures and by upgrading the utility's single window as well as its internal processes. Getting electricity was also made cheaper by reducing the costs to obtain a connection to the electric network. This reform applies to both Moscow and St. Petersburg.
- Paying taxes. Russia made paying taxes less costly by allowing a higher tax depreciation rate for fixed assets. This reform applies to both Moscow and St. Petersburg.
- Trading across borders. Russia made trading across borders easier by prioritizing online customs clearance and introducing shortened time limits for its automated comple-tion. This reform applies to both Moscow and St. Petersburg.

THE RUSSIAN ECONOMY: MODEST GROWTH AHEAD

This 39th issue of the Russia Economic Report provides an assessment of recent economic developments and the outlook for the period 2018-2020.

Russia's economic recovery continues, amidst relatively high oil prices, enhanced macroeconomic stability, gradual monetary loosening, and ongoing momentum in global economic growth.

However, Russia's growth prospects for the period 2018-20 remain modest.

Growth is forecast at between 1.5% and 1.8% in the period 2018-20. However, in the short-term, these forecasts may change due to changing oil prices.

Summary

Global growth continued its 2017 momentum and is currently expected to peak at 3.1% in 2018. Recoveries in investment, manufacturing, and trade continue as commodity-exporting developing economies benefit from firming commodity prices.

Oil prices, which firmed up in 2017, are projected to average \$65/bbl in 2018 and 2019, and \$66/bbl in 2020, but may increase further, especially in the short term.

Supported by deepening macro-economic stability and gradual monetary loosening, Russia's economy continued its recovery in 2017, mainly driven by non-tradable sectors. Growth momentum towards the end of 2017 slowed down, but picked up in the first quarter of 2018.

Russia's balance of payments remained stable. An increase in the trade surplus due to higher energy prices was the key factor behind the strengthening of the current account. Monetary policy remained consistent with the inflation-targeting regime, and is moving from moderately tight to neutral. Annual inflation now stands at a record low-level, below the Central Bank's target of 4%. The poverty rate is expected to decrease slightly due to low inflation and recoveries in private income and consumption, but remains above the pre-crisis level.


The banking sector's fundamentals are largely stable, but the share of state-controlled banking assets grew because of the continuing Central Bank clean-up. The share of state-controlled banks in the combined assets of the Russian banking system increased to nearly 70%.

Russia's growth prospects remain modest, with growth forecast to be between 1.5% and 1.8% in the 2018-20 period. However, in the short-term, these forecasts may change due to changing oil prices. Relatively high oil prices, continued momentum in the global economic growth and macro stabilization would support growth. Yet, the growth forecast for Russia for 2018 has been slightly decreased to 1.5%.

A strategic focus on digital transformation has enabled Russia to build a national digital infrastructure. However, to gain significant socio-economic benefits from these changes, Russia will need to implement policies that accelerate the digital transformation of the economy's traditional enterprise sector, and promote R&D, innovation and entrepreneurship.

SUCCESS OF THE TRADE MISSION TO MOSCOW ORGANIZED BY LUXEMBOURG CCI



From October 14th to 17th, the Chamber of Commerce of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, in close collaboration with Luxinnovation and the Embassy of Luxembourg in Moscow, organized an accompanied visit to the Skolkovo Open Innovations Forum preceded by an economic mission to Moscow. The commercial delegation, led by the Chamber of Commerce of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg, was composed of 24 companies with a total of 40 company representatives of a variety of sectors, as well as eight institutional partners including the Ministry of the Economy and the Ministry of Higher Education and Research. The last visit of the Chamber of Commerce to the Moscow Open Innovation Forum dates back to 2015.

According to the Luxembourgish statistics portal (STATEC), the Grand Duchy's exports to Russia have stabilized since 2014 and are currently increasing again. In concrete figures: last year, Luxembourg exported roughly over 151 000 000€ worth of goods to Russia (greatly through to the sale of heavy machinery, plastics and metals) and 237 000 000€ in services and imported a mere 14 000 000 € worth of products, yet 147 000 000€ worth of services. This balance sheet, in itself quite impressive, is far away from having achieved our limits. Russia's prime geographic situation has allowed the country to tie a strong network with its neighbors in Europe, in Central Asia and in the Far East. Despite the EU-Russia sanctions and the somewhat acrimonious political climate, business opportunities between the world's largest country and Luxembourg, the secondsmallest country in the European Union, could be plentiful.



The trade mission began with the first of its kind Luxembourg - Russia Business Forum held in the premises of the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of the Russian Federation (CCIRF) on October 15th. The premises, previously used as the old Moscow Stock Exchange, served as an ideal location for tailor-Business-to-Business meetings made organized between Luxembourg-based and local companies before kicking off the forum's plenary session. The latter, presenting the latest economic and innovative developments in both countries, was composed of Mr. Katyrin, President of the CCIRF, Mr. Padalko and Mr. Kurochkin. Vice-Presidents of the CCIRF, Mr. Stepanov, Head of Division of the Institute of Innovation Management at the Moscow Higher School of Economics, H.E. Mr. Knebeler, Ambassador of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg to Russia, Mr. Cresswell, Head of International Affairs at Luxinnovation and Mr. Erpelding, Director International Affairs at the Luxembourg Chamber of Commerce.



The Plenary Session was concluded with the signature of a cooperation agreement between the two Chambers of Commerce, and was followed by an expert panel on Innovation, moderated by Mr. Foy, Head of Sector Development - Digital Economy at Luxinnovation.

During said panel, Mrs. Huizinga (Deloitte), Mrs. Tkachenko (Ziffer) and Mr. Wiertz (Paul Wurth InCub') presented Luxembourgish success stories, investment climate, recent infrastructural and industrial developments, whereas the Russian side, i.e. Mr. Volostnov (Frost & Sullivan), Arseniev (RusITExport) and Mr. Amelin (Investing Russia) showcased the recent public and private initiatives of the Russian Federation. first Luxembourg - Russia Business Forum and the delegation's first day in Moscow came to an end with a networking reception held at the Ritz-Carlton Moscow, to which the members of the delegation could invite business partners and prospects.

On the second day of the mission, October 16th, the Chamber of Commerce organized an accompanied visit to the Skolkovo Open Innovations Forum, Russia's leading platform for technology, entrepreneurs and corporations to find new opportunities for development, connect with investors, partners and officials.

The Open Innovations Forum, with its 21.000 visitors, was one of the largest events in Russia and 2018 showcased its 7th edition. The Forum focuses on future technologies in the modern human society, economy and everyday life. The main topic was Humanity in the Center of the Technological Revolution. The program comprises five specific spheres of the human life that are dramatically changing under the impact of technologies – productivity, habitat, education, health and entertainment/arts.

The Skolkovo Foundation, with whom Luxinnovation signed Memoradum а Understanding (aiming to strengthen the bilateral cooperation in the field of innovation and new technologies), offered the Luxembourg delegation an accompanied visit of the fair as well as their campus. which offers shared and/or individual facilities to its tenants (over 1600 startups), including but not limited to laboratories, co-working space and financing bodies. The visit particularly shed a light onto biomedical start-ups which develop groundbreaking solutions, such as cheap and quick illness preventionkits or an open p2p biopsy-analysis platform that allows for a greater number of medical opinions.

A number of Skolkovo startup have already found their way to Luxembourg though the existing cooperation cultivated by the Skolkovo Foundation and Luxinnovation, in order to facilitate their globalization and access to the EU market. Luxinnovation previously made contacts in Russia and has seen these companies quickly becoming the Luxemboura ambassadors for economy. specifically in the start-up community where a snowball effect is currently developing. companies in question keep choosing Luxembourg as their European Hub due to its ideal environment with access to grants and personnel and its logistic facilities. The day-long visit was wrapped up with reception held at the Embassy of Luxembourg in Moscow, which allowed the delegation to make contact with the Embassy's extensive network.

The third and last day allowed for a very interesting visit of Artec 3D's Moscow office. Artec 3D is a global leader in handheld 3D scanners that has been at the forefront of innovative 3D technology since 2007.
