**Dan Fisher** 



Dan Fisher is the only candidate who has pledged to make abolishing abortion his number one priority. He has published a strategic plan to accomplish his mission using state sovereignty. He is the only candidate who has endorsed and supports Senator Silk's SB 817, the "Abolition of Abortion in Oklahoma Act," which would criminalize abortion as murder.
