

# Pitsford Water & The White Swan



**Distance:** 12.73 km

**Difficulty:** Moderate


**Dog Friendly:** Yes

**Starting location:** roadside parking is available in the vicinity of the White Swan pub (satnav: NN6 9SP).

1. With your back to the White Swan pub, set off left along Main Street. At the crossroads, turn right onto Brixworth Road and follow it out of Holcot village. Just past the turning on the right for the Pitsford Fishing Lodge, turn left onto the Pitsford Water circular path. After a short way, the path will join the water-side.

2. After approximately 8km, you will reach the The Willow Tree café where you can choose from a broad menu of snacks and meals, all at



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reasonable prices. When you leave the café, return to the cycle track and continue to follow it along the water-side.

3. Once you have crossed over the causeway, you then simply retrace your steps back to your start location in Holcot.

### **Pub: The White Swan**

The White Swan in Holcot is an 18<sup>th</sup> century thatched pub that was formerly a butchers shop and pub combined and was the training booth of British Boxing Champion Peddler Palmer in the late 1800s. It is now a three-roomed pub, with drinking areas either side of the main bar and a separate room to the rear. The pub is full of charm with its white-painted stone and thatched country style decor with discrete classic vehicle memorabilia.
