1.	ruture wish: to express something that the speaker wants to happen in the ruture.
	Wish (that) + S + would/could V _{bare}

I hope he will be here soon. ► I wish he would be here soon.
______ I would love it if you could join me next week. ► If only you could join me next week.

II. Present wish: to express a wish that is unreal at present.

Wish (that) + $S + V_{2/ed}$ Wish (that) + S + could V_{bare} Please stop smoking.

► I wish you stopped smoking. I'd rather you didn't talk to me like that.

▶ If only you didn't talk to me like that.

III. Past wish: to express regret that something did not happen the way the speaker wanted.

Wish (that) + S + had V₃ Wish (that) + S + could have V_3

She regrets selling her golden necklace.

► She wishes she hadn't sold her golden necklace.

It's a shame he couldn't come to my graduation party.

▶ If only he could have come to my graduation party. ___

IV. If only:

If only has the same meaning as wish.

Example: I wish you had visited me yesterday.

= If only you had visited me yesterday.
