TAG QUESTIONS

I. General rules:

Tag questions are formed using a statement (positive/negative) and a tag.

I'm a good friend, _____AREN'T I_____?

Let's go on the dance floor, _____SHALL WE____?

5. Let's: we use 'shall we' for the tag

1.	Negative tags:
•	Used for positive statements.
•	We form using an auxiliary that is in the same tense and for the subject of the statement.
•	If there are more than one auxiliary, we use the first one.
	They are football players,AREN'T THEY? He went into politics,DIDN'T HE?
	You would rather eat alone,WOULDN'T YOU?
	I should have knocked on the door,SHOULDN'T I?
2.	Positive tags:
•	Used for negative statements.
•	We form using an auxiliary that is in the same tense and for the subject of the statement.
•	If there are more than one auxiliary, we use the first one.
	He didn't fail his exam,DID HE?
	You can't be serious,CAN YOU?
	They haven't arrived yet,HAVE THEY?
	He couldn't have done such a thing, COULD THEY?
II.	Special cases:
1.	Someone, no one, anyone, everyone: we use 'they' for the tag
	Someone has been here before me,HAVEN'T THEY?
	Everyone loves the New Year's Eve,DON'T THEY?
	Noone is home,ARE THEY?
2.	Something, anything, nothing, everything: we use 'it' for the tag
	Anything can happen,CAN'T IT?
	Something has to be done,DOESN'T IT?
	Nothing has changed since I was here,HAS IT?
3.	Hardly, barely, scarcely, never,: we treat it as a negative statement
	They hardly ever go out,DO THEY?
	She never arrives on time,DOES SHE?
4.	I am: we use 'aren't I' or 'am I not' (old English) for the tag

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6.	'There' as a subject: we use 'there' in the tag
	There are 300 students in your school,AREN'T THERE?
	There is no one in that room,IS THERE?
7.	This/That as a subject: we use 'it' in the tag
	This is your bag,ISN'T IT?
	That was a compliment, WASN'T IT ?
8.	These/Those as a subject: we use 'they' in the tag
	These are the books you gave me,AREN'T THEY?
	Those were Joseph's friends,WEREN'T THEY?
9.	I think that/I believe that: we make the tag based on the 'that' clause
	I think that the world is getting hotter,ISN'T IT?
	I believe you haven't given me my money,HAVE YOU?
10	. Imperatives:
•	In most cases, we use 'will you' in the tag. (invitations, demand, reminder). We may sometimes use
	'won't you'.
	Come to my birthday party,WILL YOU/WON'T YOU?
	Don't forget to return the books, WILL YOU/WON'T YOU?
•	We use 'would you' or 'could you please' for polite requests.
	Please hold my bag for me,WOULD YOU?
	Pass me the salt on the table,COULD YOU PLEASE?
