## **SUBJUNCTIVE**

In most cases, subjunctive is used to express urgency or importance.

- Present Subjunctive: we use the bare form of the verb (V<sub>bare</sub>) or SHOULD + V<sub>bare</sub>.
- Past Subjunctive: we use the same form of verbs as in Past Simple, but we use 'were' for all Subjects, including I/He/She/It.

I. V	Vould rather/would sooner (that) + S + PAST Subjunctive:
Would ra	ather/would sooner (that) has similar meaning to wish:
	Please do not smoke inside the building.
	I would rather (that) you didn't smoke inside the building.
	I wish he came here in time.
	I would sooner (that) he came here in time.
II. It	t's (high/about) time + S + PAST Subjunctive:
	It's time for us to take matters into our own hands.
	It's high time we took matters into our own hands
	Erina thinks we should leave.
	Erina thinks it's about time we left
III. •	Verbs (that) S + PRESENT Subjunctive:
These ve	erbs require <b>THAT + Subjunctive clause</b> : advise, command, demand, desire, insist, order, propose,
recomm	end, request, suggest, etc.
	"Let's go to the library after class" said Peter.
	Peter suggested that we go to the library.
	"The shelves need to be clean now!" said the captain.
	The captain ordered that the shelves be cleaned then.
IV. •	It's + adjective (that) S + PRESENT Subjunctive:
These ad	ljectives require THAT + Subjunctive clause: advisable, best, compulsory, crucial, desirable,
	l, imperative, important, necessary, obligatory, unthinkable, urgent, vital, etc.
	Everyone has to obey the traffic laws.
	It is obligatory that everyone obey the traffic laws
	I think you should have a doctor check on your lungs.
	It is advisable that you have a doctor check on your lungs.
	Please fax these documents to Henry now.
	It is urgent that these documents be sent to Henry now
	I hope you do not bother me when I work on this.
	It is desirable that you not bother me when I work on this.
