

# ANOTHER – OTHER – THE OTHER

## I. Using as Adjectives:

**another** and **other** can be used before **non-specific Nouns**.

**another** is used for **singular** nouns, while **other** is used for plural or **uncountable** nouns.

*My pen has run out of ink. Can I borrow **another pen**?*

*This apple seems to be rotten. Do you have **another one**?*

*Unlike **other male students**, Drake enjoys cooking a lot.*

*There are **other places** you can visit when you go to Dalat.*

**the other** is used before **specific Nouns**.

*This hammer is broken. Can you get me **the other one** in the toolbox?*

*Mike doesn't get along well with **the other students** in his class.*

*In a relationship, it is important to know what the other person is feeling.*

## II. Using as Nouns:

We use these words to replace a Noun when we can understand what the speaker is saying without the noun.

- **another** is used to replace **non-specific singular Nouns**.
- **others** is used to replace **non-specific plural Nouns**.
- **the other** is used to replace **specific singular Nouns**.
- **the others** is used to replace **specific plural Nouns**.

*My pen has run out of ink. Can I borrow **another**?*

*You should go out more often to talk to **others**.*

*In a relationship, it is important to know what **the other** is feeling.*

*Mike doesn't get along well with **the others** in his class.*

**NOTE:** We always use other/others after quantifiers.

*Do you have **any other pens**?*

*Some people like reading, but **many others** prefer playing games.*

*I'll come over with **a few other** friends.*

***Any other** person has the same answer?*
