# **MUST - HAVE TO - NEED**

### I. Must and mustn't:

Must + V<sub>bare</sub> expresses an obligation to do something.

Mustn't + V<sub>bare</sub> expresses an obligation NOT to do something.

**Must** and **mustn't** can only be used in the present. [K-12 Notes] Vì mustn't không tồn tại trong quá khứ, nên để diễn tả ý "không được phép" ở quá khứ, ta mượn từ "couldn't"

#### Example:

Children must learn to obey their parents.

You **mustn't smoke** here. This is a non-smoking area.

Your car isn't finished yet. You will must come back here tomorrow.

Joe **must come** back home <mark>vesterday</mark> because he had forgotten to bring his ID card.

#### II. Have to and not have to:

**Have to + V**<sub>bare</sub> expresses an **obligation** to do something.

Not have to +  $V_{bare}$  expresses an unnecessity to do something.

**Have to** and **Not have to** can be used in the past, present, or future.

## Example:

Children <u>have to learn</u> to obey their parents.

VIPs don't have to wait to enter the bar.

Your car isn't finished yet. You will have to come back here tomorrow.

Joe <u>had to come</u> back home <mark>yesterday</mark> because he had forgotten to bring his ID card.

We <u>didn't have to</u> water the plant because it was raining.

## III. Need, not need to, needn't

Need + to V is the same as have to

Not need + to V is the same as not have to.

**Needn't + V\_{bare}** is the same as not need to, but can only be used in the present.

#### Example:

Children <u>need to learn</u> to obey their parents.

VIPs <u>don't need to wait</u> to enter the bar.

(= VIPs **needn't wait** to enter the bar.)

Your car isn't finished yet. You will need to come back here tomorrow.

Joe <u>needed to come</u> back home <mark>yesterday</mark> because he had forgotten to bring his ID card.
