

29 October: Alzheimer Europe launches new Dementia in Europe magazine and MOPEAD project supplement at its conference

On 29 October, the latest edition of “Dementia in Europe” magazine was officially launched, during the 28th Alzheimer Europe Conference #28AEC, in Barcelona, Spain.

This time, the magazine includes a special 16-page supplement showcasing the work of the “Models Of Patient Engagement for Alzheimer’s Disease” (MOPEAD) project. Alzheimer Europe was responsible for producing the project’s ethical guidance document and is contributing to the communication activities of this four-year project (2016–2019), founded under the auspices of the Innovative Medicines Initiative (IMI) 2 Joint Undertaking.

This special supplement includes a general overview of the project, information about each of the project’s work-streams and their goals, interviews with the project leadership, as well as some of the great educational materials on Alzheimer’s disease and dementia the project has produced.

The 28th edition of the “Dementia in Europe” magazine itself features a variety of articles showcasing the progress of Alzheimer research in Europe, including an interview with Carlos Moedas, EU Commissioner for Research, Science and Innovation, in which he highlights current and future European priorities for dementia research. Alzheimer Europe’s most recent European Parliament lunch debate focusing on dementia care also features in the magazine, as does the progress being made by ongoing European projects in which Alzheimer Europe are involved, including EPAD and the 2nd EU Joint Action on Dementia. There is an article about Alzheimer Europe’s Carers’ Survey, and the policy pages cover important forward strides in Portugal and Sweden, among others.

The magazine also has a special 28AEC conference section, focusing on the work of Alzheimer Europe’s Spanish members, and on dementia research in Spain and especially in Barcelona.
