Weed Update:

A Letter from Gene Centi, Town of Caroga Weed Program Coordinator

Hope the winter was kind to everyone. Summer is approaching and we are gearing up our invasive weed programs for West and East Caroga lakes. In a very brief summary, the town has been very proactive this year in it's support and direction we are going with the program. They have essentially doubled the operating budget for the 2018 season. This will allow me to add additional divers and tenders. If possible, I would like to add a full second crew. However, to accomplish this, I need to find divers and tenders. Tenders do not need to be certified divers. If anyone you have contact with is a certified scuba diver, please have them contact me.

I am also in need of two to four kayak/ canoe volunteers who would be willing to "scout" West Caroga and mark the sites that have obvious invasive plant growth. Doing this once or twice a week during the season will be a big help to the program. Anyone interested should contact me ASAP.

Caroga Lake Marina has also agreed to allow a lake steward at their boat launch to inspect boats entering and leaving the lake. If you are interested in a volunteer position there for a few hours a week, please let me know and I will put you in touch with Mike Durkee who is overseeing this segment of the program.

Thanks for the continued support from the West Caroga Lake Association.

Words about WEEDS and the WCLA:

Only weeds identified as invasive species can be harvested as part of the Caroga Lake weed program. Milfoil is the weed that is the concentration of the program. Other weeds can be picked by individuals or you can hire the divers on their off time to pick certain areas. If you need more info go through the weed program coordinator Gene Centi at the number(s) listed above to contact divers.

The WCLA is 220 members strong. It would be great if we could have a strong presence volunteering to be lake stewards at the Caroga Lake Marina, owned and operated by Karl and Carol Zeiman, WCLA members.

The WCLA has purchased 360 butterfly nets and will be giving these to our members and others that use the lakes that have invasive weed problems. The

idea is to educate boaters and lake front owners about floating weeds. These weeds will sink and re-root if they are not removed from the lake. The slogan for the campaign is:

"SEE IT, SCOOP IT, TRASH IT"




Survey Results:


Below are the results of the member survey we have received so far, a total of 107 responses.

Will you except email copy of the newsletter instead of a printed copy? Yes - 98 | No - 9




Would you support a dues raise to \$25 for the 2019/2020 year? Yes - 96 | No - 11





Tidbits of History

Enjoy some of these fun facts and tidbits of history about Caroga Lake and the surrounding areas.

• During the oil embargo of 1973-74, Clayton Shutt's station, the only one in town, ran out of gas. People could not get to work. Logging operations were curtailed, and the town's plight was so severe that the story made the New York Times.

Women Stepping Up:

• Millie Busch started as a postal clerk in 1959 under postmaster Edward Faber. She took over from him in 1971. She retired in 1989 after 30 years with the Caroga postal service. If you needed to know what was going on in town, she would know.

- Diane MacGregor was the Town Clerk from 1972-1997 (25 years). Linda Gilbert, a WCLA member, is the current Town Clerk.
- Emma Krause was the first woman elected as Town Supervisor in 1966, serving until 1983. From 1970-1971 she was the first woman to be chosen as the Chairman of the Fulton County Board of Supervisors.

Night on the Town:

• Many taverns have come and gone over the years in Caroga Lake. Do you remember the Chicken Coup, the Christmas Tree (on the golf course), Tommy DeMetre's tavern, formerly the Caroga Lake Hotel which burned and was bulldozed to add to Sherman's parking, and Nicholson's....over the years called Club 29, Danny's II, Denises's Restaurant, My Place, Lido's Lounge, and lastly the Crazy Horse. I remember it being advertised as the longest bar with the shortest bartender.

Toboggan Slide:

• In 1972, Pat and Don Best bought Vrooman's Hotel. Don had the idea of constructing a toboggan slide next to the hotel. With his vision and the help of his sons and many local volunteers, the toboggan slide was finished in November 1975. It was 39 feet high, 10 feet wide, 165 feet long. It was dismantled just three years later because of insurance issues.

Mud Bowl:

• The Pine Lake Mud Bowl was the high point of early fall activities

from 1975-1984. A Caroga team played against a team of Fulton Montgomery Community College athletes. In the ten years the game was played the Caroga team was 8-1-1. The games were held in a bog near the entrance to Pine Lake Park. The mud would get up to four feet deep. Fun, fun, fun.

Associations:

- East Caroga Lake Protective Association was formed in 1917 with an annual fee of \$3.
- Kirchens Grove Association was formed in 1920.
- Canada Lake Protective Association was formed in 1922 with 39 charter members.
- West Caroga Lake Association was formed in 1988. We have grown from 75 to 220 members as of 2017.
