The Lehigh County Authority (LCA) recently completed their first Lifespan installations with an in-road installation as well as a 'off-road' installation near the Little Lehigh river near Camp Olympic. The off-road site is important as this area is often subject to flooding where the manholes are completely submerged for days at a time during heavy rains.

Through this system, all wastewater is transported to the City of Allentown's wastewater treatment plant. In addition, LCA operates three small wastewater treatment plants and a pretreatment plant to serve certain commercial properties
