

The Tolliver Family Endowment Agricultural Scholarship

Award Criteria

This scholarship will provide monetary assistance to a graduating high-school senior who meets the following requirements:

1. The student must be in the upper one-half of the graduating class.
2. The student must be an active member of a Clinton County FFA organization.
3. The student must exhibit positive characteristics of leadership, service and character.
4. The student must plan to attend an accredited two-year or four-year college, university or technical school pursuing an **agricultural-related** degree.
5. The student must exhibit a financial need.
6. The student may not be a relative of the Ullis or Steve Tolliver family.

Selection Procedure

Application, recommendations and photo must be received by The Clinton County Foundation by March 1 of the current year.

The Tolliver Family Agricultural Scholarship Endowment Committee Board of Trustees will select the recipient after review of the applications for the scholarship in relation to the requirements as outlined in the application form.

Applicants will be notified by mail regarding the scholarship award status.

The scholarship award will be mailed directly to the college, university, or school in which the student will be attending to be applied directly to the student's tuition account.

For an applicant to apply for this scholarship, the following must be completed and submitted to The Clinton County Foundation by March 1 of the current year: 1) completed and signed application form, 2) official transcript of high school grades and class standing, 3) a letter of recommendation form the student's FFA Advisor, 4) a letter of recommendation from a school counselor, academic advisor, employer, or personal reference, 5) a photo of applicant. ALL materials must be submitted at one time by the applicant.
