The Victorian Mini Club will hold a Club Khanacross at VMCI Rolling Thunder Park, Parwan South Road, Parwan South on 27th August, 2017.

The event will be conducted under the International Sporting Code of the F.I.A., the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Limited (CAMS), The Khanacross Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations, and any Further Regulations or instructions which may be issued, and shall be subject to CAMS PERMIT NUMBER 317/2708/11.

This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au. Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by CAMS in relation to the event. Event

The event will be a Single Club Competitive Khanacross. Tests will be advised to competitors on the day. There will be a minimum of four tests which may be run multiple times throughout the event, with official timing & results being issued following the event. This a competitive event.

Entries

Entries must be made on official the entry form or via the VMCI Website. Entries open on publication of these Regulations and close at the commencement of Drivers Briefing. Additional entries and briefings may be held at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.

All entry must be made in person on the day of competition with disclaimer forms signed.

Entry fee are as per the entry form for the event. The maximum number of entries shall be 35, accepted in order of receipt. All competitors will be current financial members of the Victorian Mini Club Inc on the date of the event. The Promoter reserves the right to refuse entry in accordance with NCR83.

The Organisers reserve the right to adjust or waive the entry fee to participants who have made a significant contribution on the organising committee of the event.

Documentation and Scrutiny

Documentation and Scrutiny will commence at 9:00am on the day of the event at the venue. Drivers must present their CAMS Licence (Level 2NS or superior), Victorian Mini Club Inc. membership card and vehicle logbook (if issued). Licences will be available for purchase on the day.

All vehicles must undergo a scrutiny check where the requirements of Schedule A and Group 4H of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport will be checked. Drivers apparel, including helmets, must comply with the requirements of Schedule D of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport and be presented at Scrutiny. All Fuel must comply with the requirements of Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions.

Competition Portion

- A compulsory drivers briefing will be held not before 9:30am on the day of the event. Official runs will commence at the conclusion of the briefing.
- This briefing will not be conducted until event setup on the day is complete.

Classes

Vehicle classes will be as per the VMCI competition guidelines available from www.mini.org.au. Participants will be eligible for points on the official VMCI point score, towards the appropriate [2017](#) VMCI championships.

Any significant officials as judged by CofC will be eligible for VMCI club 'official' status credits. Non-competing officials will be eligible for compensation points as per the VMCI competition guidelines.

Protests

Any protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the NCR.

Abandonment

The Promoters reserve the right to abandon, postpone or cancel the meeting in accordance with NCR 59.

Alcohol, Drugs and Other Substances

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.
