Council Update: Nearly 97% of funded programs meet performance assessment

At its monthly meeting, Children's Services Council staff updated the board on the most recent Comprehensive Program Performance Assessment (CPPA), for year-end 2017-2018, in which programs were monitored on data quality and program implementation, operations and outcomes. Of the 61 programs reviewed, 41 were scored using the standard CPPA assessment and 20 were given the short form, which reviews whether programs are meeting deliverables.
