Recognizing the first CUCCC Student Leadership Board

The Campbell University Community Care Clinic (CUCCC) officially opened on March 31, 2015. Since its opening, Campbell University's weekly student run free clinic has tended to the healthcare needs of Harnett County in rural North Carolina. After only one year, the CU clinic averages 8-10 patients per night, has seen approximately 110 new patients, and been rewarded with over \$7,500 in donations and \$4,000 in grants. Every Tuesday evening, volunteer physicians and teams of medical, physician assistant, and pharmacy students are able to see and treat patients even though these patients are uninsured. The clinic has a pharmacy and lab on site, and it partners with Valley Radiology and Betsy Johnson Hospital for imaging and Project Access to UNC Health Care's Charity Care Program for patient referrals. Each patient receives a follow-up phone call by our Continuity of Care student board members, who cater to the English or Spanish speaking needs of our patients. Additionally, Campbell University interest groups, clubs, faculty, and students have been instrumental in fundraising for the clinic. On behalf of the executive student leadership board of CUCCC, we and our patients thank you. The student run free clinic would not be operational without the support from Campbell University and the surrounding community.
