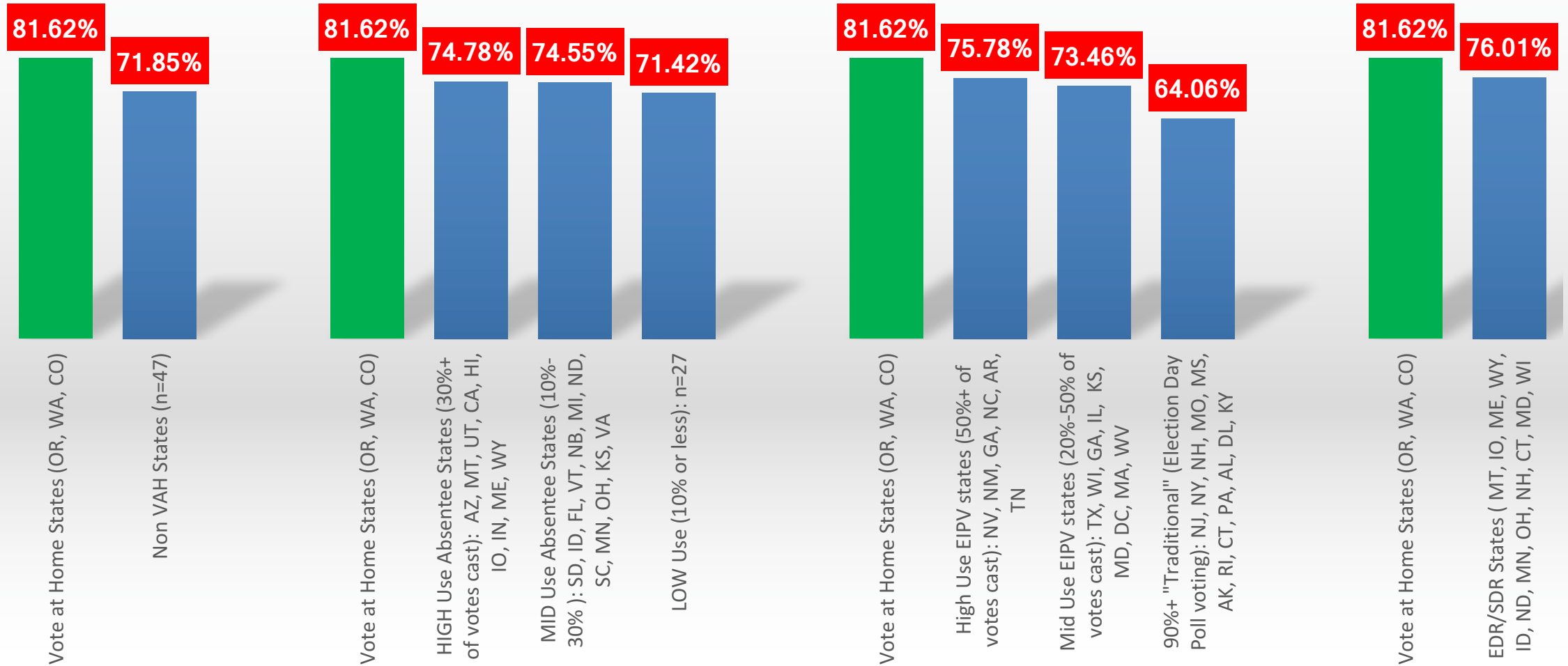
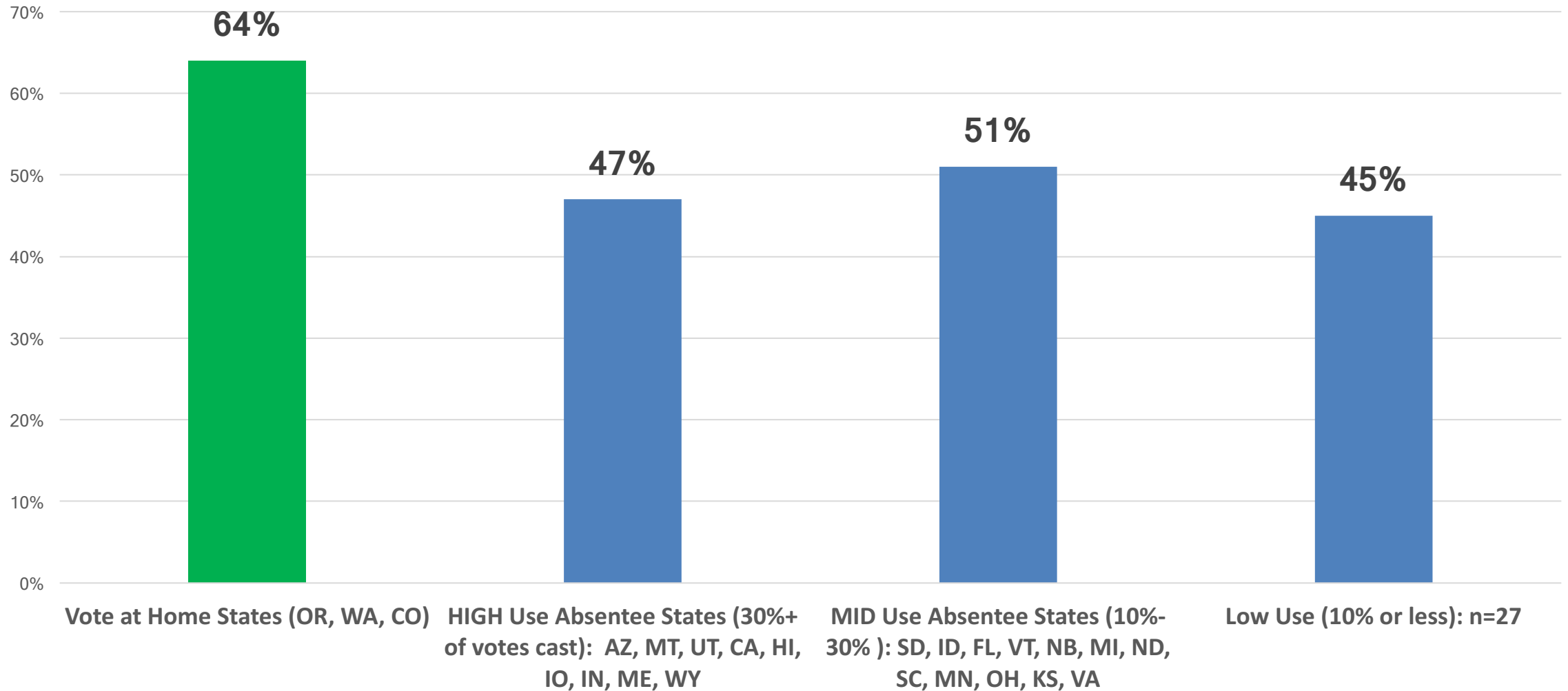


2016: Active RV turnout in Vote at Home States significantly outperformed all combinations of absentee ballot use, Early in Person Voting (EIPV) and even SDR/EDR



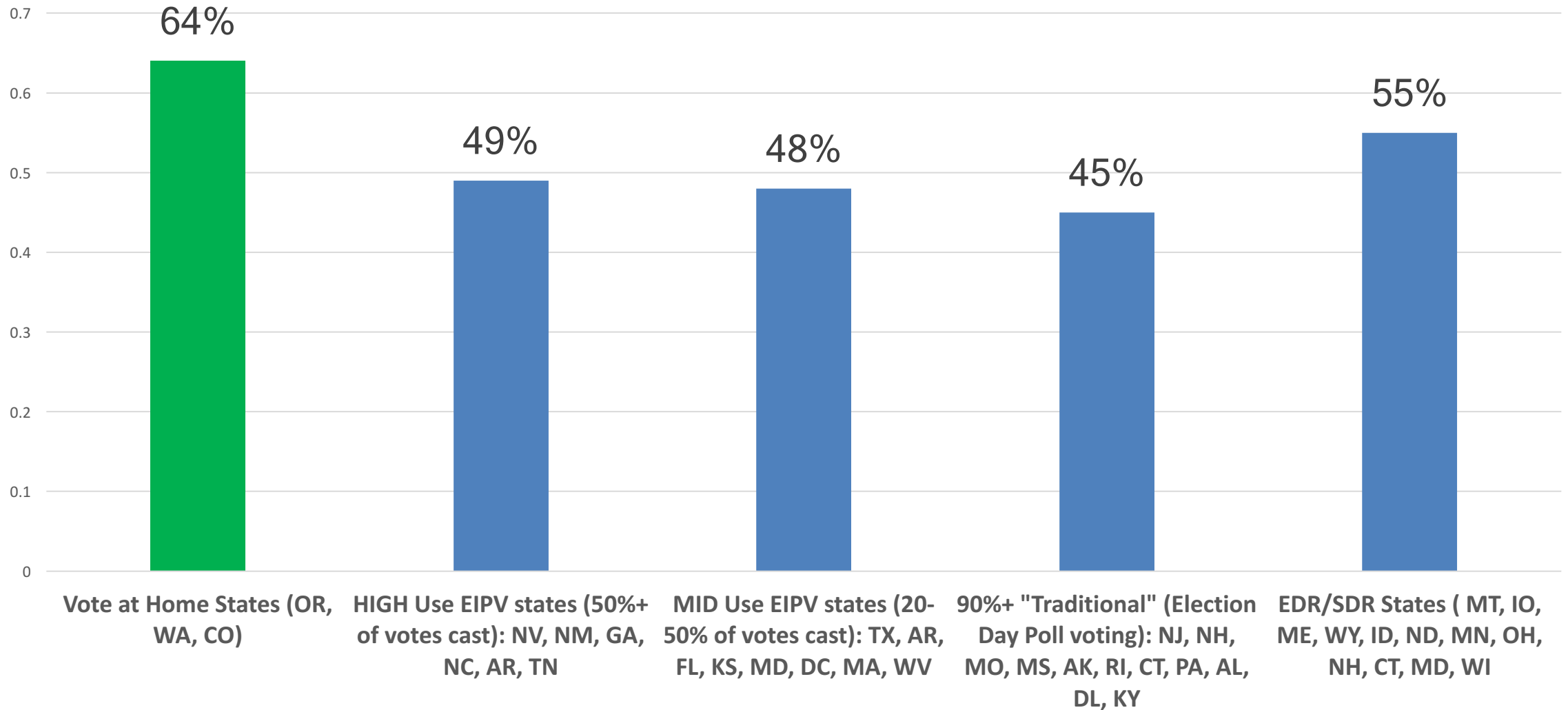

2014 Election: Turnout of Active Registered Voters in 3 Vote at Home States vs. other States with Varying Use of Absentee Ballots



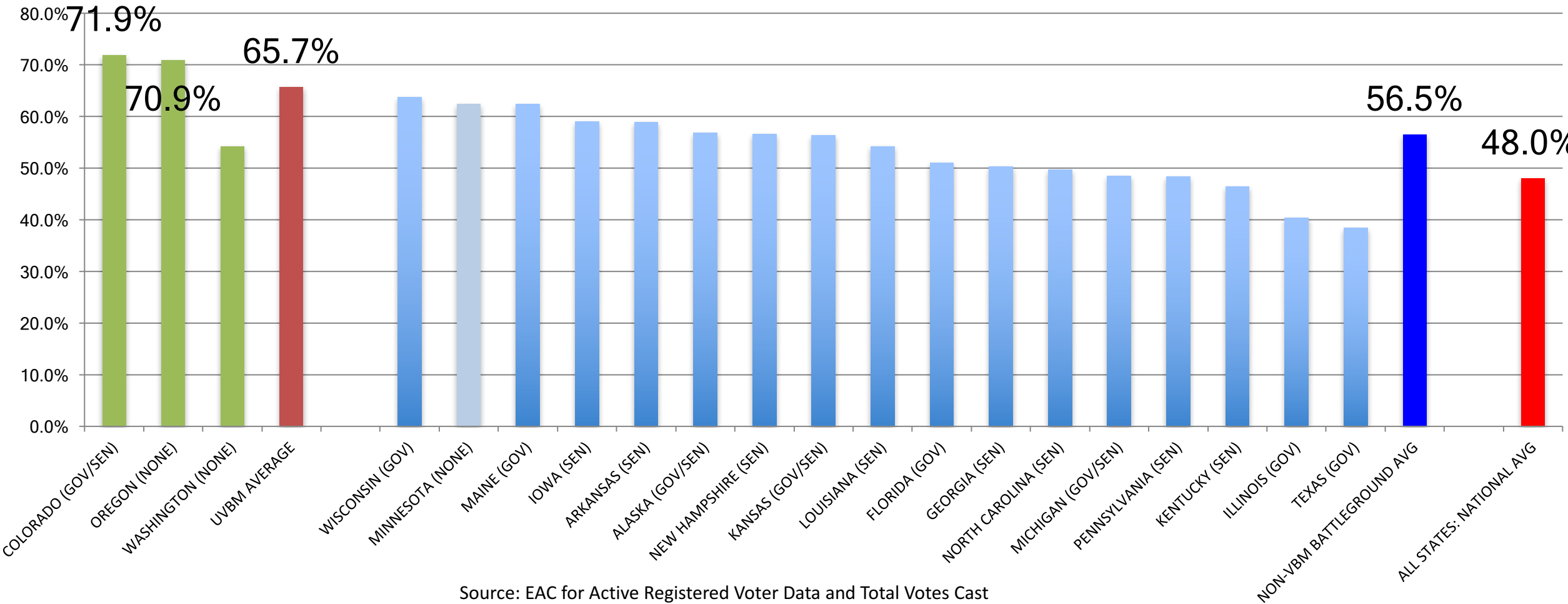

These **3** “Vote at Home” States in **2014** had Far Higher Turnout of Active Registered Voters (**65.7%**) than that year’s 17 Battleground States (**56.5%**) – not to mention vs. the National Average of **48%**. (Only CO was both)
