## Bloomfield Public Library Monday Afternoon at the Movies

**September 3, 2018 – LABOR DAY (LIBRARY CLOSED)**

**September 10, 2018 – MOON**

Astronaut Sam Bell's (*Sam Rockwell*) three-year shift at a lunar mine is finally ending, and he is looking forward to his reunion with his wife (*Dominique McElligott*) and young daughter. Suddenly, Sam's health takes a drastic turn for the worse. He suffers painful headaches and hallucinations, and almost has a fatal accident. He meets what appears to be a younger version of himself, possibly a clone. With time running out, Sam must solve the mystery before the company crew arrives - 2009 – Color – 1hr 37min – R.

**September 17, 2018 – INSIDE HANA'S SUITCASE**

This Holocaust documentary recounts the story of a Jewish girl from Czechoslovakia named Hana Brady, whom the Nazis orphaned and separated from her brother, George. The delivery of a battered suitcase to Fumiko Ishioka at the Tokyo Holocaust Museum begins the true-life mystery that became the subject of Karen Levine's best-selling book *Hana's Suitcase*. Much of the storytelling is conveyed through re-enactments, photos, surviving elderly associates and George, who is now in his 80s and living in Canada. We learn of the Brady family's happy home life and of the sadly familiar sequence of brutality – 2009 – Color – 1hr 33min – NR.

**September 24, 2018 – I FEEL PRETTY**

A woman (*Amy Schumer*) who struggles with feelings of insecurity and inadequacy on a daily basis wakes from a fall believing she is suddenly the most beautiful and capable woman on the planet. With this newfound confidence, she is empowered to live her life fearlessly and flawlessly, but what will happen when she realizes her appearance never changed?
