Desired specializations include, but are not limited to: design, science/technology/societies, heritage, and environment. Geographical area specialization is open, but we prefer someone who complements existing expertise. Scholars focused on topics of race and structural inequalities are desired. The candidate is expected to contribute to Wayne State University's mission [as a premier urban research university](#).

We are seeking a colleague who has a developing or ongoing research program in applied anthropology, a record of, or potential for publication, a history or potential for securing external funding, and a commitment to diversity and providing a multicultural learning environment for undergraduate and graduate students. The successful candidate will be expected to take advantage of our location in Detroit and contribute to the department's "Anthropology of the City" initiative. In doing so, she/he will be expected to establish a strong network of community collaborators. The candidate will also be responsible for teaching new and existing undergraduate and graduate courses, and coordinating student internships and practicums.
