

saying to them,




"Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied *there* and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to Me."


If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord has need of them,' and immediately he will send them."


This took place to


The disciples went


Anointing Jesus



Matthew 26:6-13



Judas' Betrayal





betray Jesus.






While they were

Jesus Prays in the Garden




Then Jesus came




And when they had

save Him."



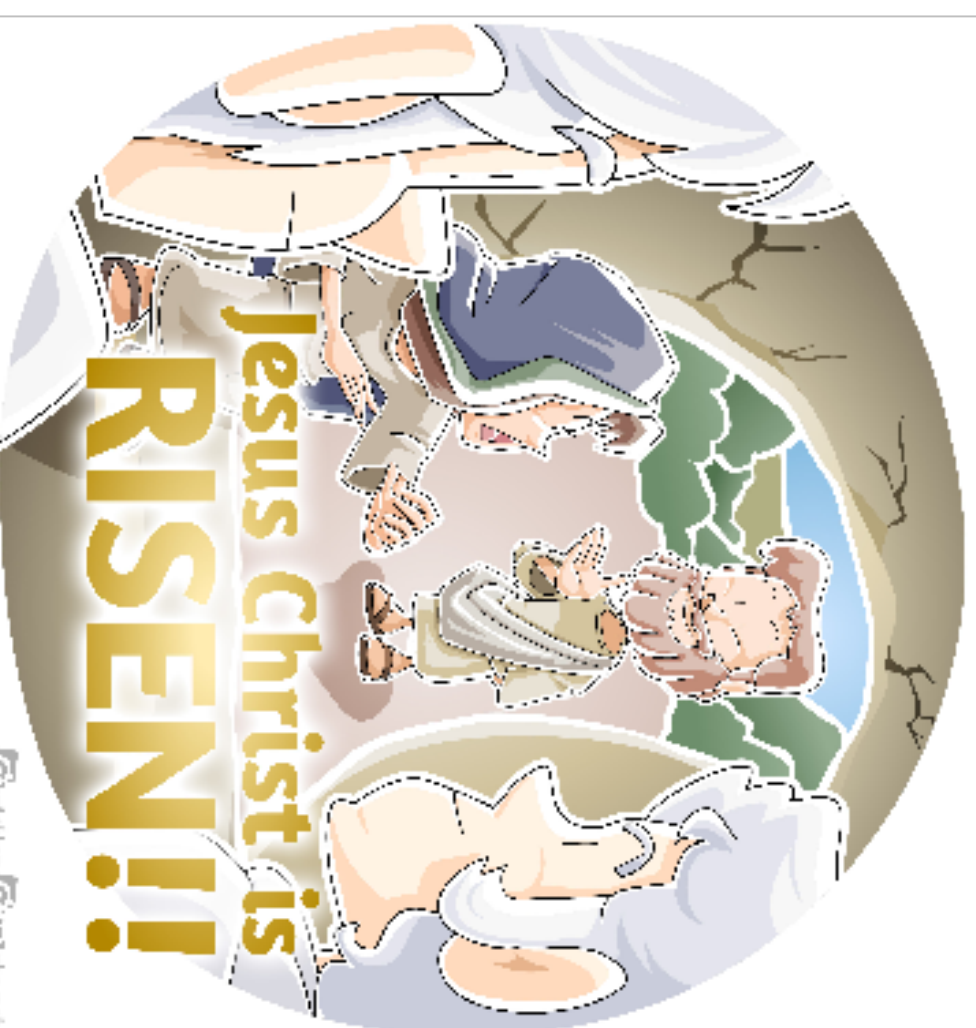


And behold, the


And his




He is not here,

was lying.




Go quickly and tell
