I. OVERVIEW OF ESCUELA DE GUADALUPE

At Escuela de Guadalupe we are proud to serve a diverse body of bilingual, multicultural learners from across the socioeconomic spectrum.

Escuela's nationally recognized program was founded in 1999 in north Denver as a response to the community's determination to confront increasingly frequent incidents of youth violence, teen pregnancy and high dropout rates. Today, our independent, dual-language Catholic school has expanded to include pre-kindergarten and middle school programs. By making quality, crosscultural education financially accessible to families throughout the Denver metro area, Escuela works to ensure that the economic status of a child never determines his or her ability to succeed.

II. WHAT IS THE STUDENT SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM?

Student scholarship funding allows Escuela de Guadalupe to fulfill its mission of creating equity in education by making up the critical difference between what families are able to pay and the actual cost of educating a student. While all Escuela families are required to make some level of financial commitment to their child's education, 90 percent currently receive need-based tuition assistance.

Our Student Sponsorship Program creates an opportunity for Escuela supporters to contribute financially to this cause while also getting to know our school on a personal level by engaging in a variety of meaningful activities including student mailings, a student-hosted partner luncheon, and invitations to participate in a number of school-wide activities throughout the academic year.

One hundred percent of gifts made through the Student Sponsorship Program go directly to facilitate the education and empowerment of Escuela de Guadalupe students and their families.

CLASS SPONSOR (starting at \$22,500): Maximize your impact by sponsoring an entire class of future leaders. By joining Escuela's Sponsorship Program at this level, you will play an important role in preparing over twenty-two ambitious and motivated students to become role models in their communities.

FULL SPONSOR (starting at \$7,500/yr): When you become a Full Student Sponsor, you give the gift of quality, dual-language Catholic education to an Escuela student exhibiting the highest level of financial need. This gift opens the door to a choice-filled future that might otherwise not be afforded to a child living at or below the poverty line.

CLASS LUNCH AND LEARN: Once a year, Class Sponsors will be invited to campus to share a celebratory lunch with the class of students being supported by their generous gift. Through a series of games, presentations, and conversations over lunch, the sponsored students and their teachers will share news about what they're studying in class and update their guests of honor on the class's recent events and service work.
