
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

On 1 October, the BLT (-) was participating in Operation LANCASTER II, TROUSDALE NORTH under the operational control of the 9th Harines. The BLT (-) was located in the vicinity of XD 699617 in the western portion of the LANCASTER II Area of Operation.

At 0930H on 1 October, the BLT (-) was helilifted to the southern portion of the BMZ in vicinity of XD 9867 and XD 9868 grid squares to participate in Operation LANCASTER II. During this part of the reporting periody the BLT (-) was under the operational control of the 3d Marines and conducted search and destroy operations in the aforementioned grid squares.







On 17 October, the BIT (-) was helilifted to the Cua Viet area to participate in two separate operations in the NAPOLEAN - SALINE A.O. The operations, conducted 18 October, involved the employment of two Companies in a cordon of a resettlement village on the north bank of the Cua Viet River and a two company Search and Destroy Operation from the Ocean View position to the DMZ.


At 1300H on 19 October, the BIM (-) commenced re-embarkation upon assigned ARG shipping.

At OSCOH on 25 October, the BIT (-) conducted a heliborne amphibious assault to conduct cordon and search operations in the 1st Marines TAOR. At 153OH on 25 October, operational control of the BIT (-) was passed to 1st Marines and the BIT (-) continued cordon and search, and search and destroy operations in the 1st Marines TAOR. On 27 October the remainder of the BIT was off-loaded and proceeded to FIC Da Nang to establish a BIT Rear ashore and conduct extensive rehabilitation of equipment.

- 1. MISSION. During the month the BLT was assigned the following missions:
 - a. 1 October, 1968 (Operation LANCASTER II TROUSDALE NORTH).
- (1) Prepare for helilift and participation in Operation LANCASTER II under OPCON of 3d Marines.
 - b. 1 to 17 October, 1968 (Operation LANCASTER II).
- (1) Conduct Search and Destroy Operations in the northern LANCASTER II Area of Operations to destroy enemy fortifications, supplies, and equipment.
- (2) Conduct Search and Destroy Operations along known road in vicinity of XD 9667 to the Ben Hai River for the purpose of locating and destroying enemy caches, supplies and equipment.
 - c. 17 to 19 October, 1968 (Operation NAPOLEAN SALINE).
- (1) Conduct a Cordon and Search of Xuan Khanh Resettlement Village with two rifle companies.
- (2) Conduct a Search and Destroy Operation of two company strength from the Ocean View position to the DMZ.
 - d. 25 October, 1968 (Operation EAGER HUNTER).
- (1) Conduct Amphibious Assault to find, fix and destroy enemy forces, caches, and installations in the AOA and withdraw on order.





- e. 26 to 31 October, 1968 (Operation GARRARD BAY).
 - (1) Conduct a Cordon and Search Operation of the View Dong Village Complex.
- (2) On order, conduct Search and Destroy Operations in the Phong Ho Village ruins area.
- (3) On order, conduct Cordon and Search Operations in the Tra Khe (2) and Tra Lo Village Complexes.
- (4) On order, conduct Cordon and Search Operations in the Mai Kim Son (Marble Mountain) Village Complex.
- 2. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS
- Ol Oct At OlO9OOH, Operational Control of BLT 2/26 passed from 9th to 3rd Marines for a special operation in the IMZ.

- Ol Oct At Oll530H, Slmm Mortar Platoon received 18-20 rounds of NVA 130mm at XD 969678 resulting in 2 USMC KIA and 21 USMC WIA.
- Ol Oct At Oll700H, JBG engaged 10-12 NVA at XD 981662 resulting in 2 USMC KIA, 3 USMC WIA and 3 NVA KIA(C).

O2 Oct At O2132OH, JBG made contact with 11 NVA in a bunker complex at XD 979688.

2 USMC were KIA during the initial contact. Subsequent Fixed Wing mission resulted in 2 NVA KBA(C) and approximately 5 bunkers destroyed.

O2 Oct At O21440H, JBH found 7 living bunkers capable of alceping 8 to 9 people. Bunkers appeared not to have been used in some time. The bunkers were destroyed.

O2 Oct At O2233OH, JBG at XD 974687 heard tracked vehicles, voices and screaming 500 to a 1000 meters from their position. Artillery missions were conducted with excellent target coverage. An attempt was made to conduct Fixed Wing missions but the BLT was unable to illuminate the target for pilot orientation purposes since no arty battery available was within illumination range.

03 Oct At 030130H, JBF received 4 rounds of 130mm artillery resulting in 2 USMC KIA and 5 USMC WIA. Artillery came from an unknown direction and range. No action was possible.

O3 Oct At O31140H, an AO under JB control detected two underwater bridges at XD 994704.

AO directed 2 flights of Fixed Wing resulting in the destruction of the bridges, one additional culvert type bridge on the road being searched was destroyed and the road was cut in three places.

O3 Oct At O31300H, JBG made contact with NVA in bunkers on top of the company objective at XD 979688. JBH at XD 976684 has made no contact and is continuing to move to a flanking position. JBE found a complex of vehicle revetments at XD 978676, they also found a vehicle parking area at XD 983670. Both were destroyed.

03 Oct At 032005H, JBG while directing artillery fire on a bunker complex at AD 979688 observed 6 secondary explosions.

04 Oct At 041325H, JBH found a 152mm gun position and 10-12 rounds of 152mm ammo at XD 984688. This finding occurred as JBH was moving to a position from which to attack the flank and rear of the bunker complex that JBG was engaging.

04 Oct At 041500H, JBH made contact with an estimated 25 NVA. JBH destroyed 3 machine gun bunkers and 1 60mm position. JBH also captured documents, small arms ammunition, RPG rounds and 1 60mm Mortar that was physically wrestled from its crew. Action resulted in 3 NVA KIA(C) and 14 USMC WIA.

04 Oct At 041800H, JBG encountered an NVA machine gun position and several bunkers at XD 979688. JBG manuvered and threw grenades into the bunkers. Results of the action were 1 USMC KIA, 2 USMC WTA and 2 NVA KIA(C).

O5 Oct At O50001H, JOHN BROWN * (BLT 2/26) call sign was changed to SNUB NOSE.

O5 Oct At O50730H, 81mm Mortar Platoon Forward Observer spotted an enemy bunker and truck at XD 996697. An Artillery mission was fired resulting in 3 secondary explosions.

O5 Oct At O51745H, SNH at XD 958698 received 6 to 8 rounds of 130nm. A counterartillery mission was fired on XD 984704. SNH reported 3 secondary explosions.

O6 Oct At O61140H, SNF and SNH heard enemy artillery firing from approximately XD 982704 and YD 025738. Counter-Artillery mission was conducted resulting in 2 secondary explosions.

O6 Oct At O61245H, SNH found 150 rounds of 152mm at XD 985686. Awaiting further instructions from HALL MARK.

O6 Oct At O62045H, SNE F.O. conducting prep fires on XD 991692 observed 30 to 35 secondary explosions.

07 Oct At 070900H, A.O. working for SNUB NOSE observed an cil slick on the Ben Hai River at XD 994704. Oil slick believed to be from enemy fuel drums that were ruptured by Close Air Support strikes conducted on bridges and dikes in the area.

O7 Oct At O71345H, SNE received 12 rounds of 82mm from XD 997687. Artillery and Air will be directed on suspected mortar sites.

07 Oct At 071620H, SNE reported receiving approximately 5 rounds of 82mm incoming from XD 997688, resulting in 2 USMC WIA (minor). Counter-mortar fires being conducted.

07 Oct At 071415H, SNE while moving on a road at XD 985686 incurred 4 USMC WIA due to a command detenated device. Also received 130mm incoming at the same time from XD 984702. SNE withdrew and directed an artillery mission on the enemy positions.

07 Oct At 07171CH, SNH found a Soviet made 6 cylinder diesel, full track prime mover at XD 988689. Vehicle was partially burned. Appeared to have been hit by a 105mm round. There was a winch on the front bumper similar to our 6 X 6. On the rear a coupling device for pulling an artillery piece or something of that nature.

07 Oct At 071716H, SNH discovered 85mm gun pits with ammo bunkers containing 40 rounds of 85mm ammo. Pits, bunkers and ammo were destroyed. This finding occurred as SNH was being maneuvered to the flank of an enemy position at XD 988689.

O8 Oct At O81025H, an A.O. controlled by SNUB NOSE observed 200 to 300 meters of trench line and bunkers at XD 988693. C.A.S was committed resulting in 3 NVA KBA(C).

O8 Oct At O8111CH, SN received 3 rounds of 75mm fired from the vicinity of XD 988693. C.A.S. was committed resulting in the destruction of 3 bunkers, 1 truck revetment and 1 NVA KBA(C).

O8 Oct At O81800H, SNH reported contact with enemy elements defending a hill at XD 988689 from 1400H to 1730H. Results of contact were: 2 USMC KIA, 11 USMC WIA and 17 NVA KIA(C). SNH also observed numerous bodies being dragged away. NVA equipment captured included U.S. 782 gear, 2 AK-47°s and 2 AK-50°s.

O8 Oct At O81530H, SNE came under 82mm mortar attack at XD 987688. Results of attack were 1 USMC KIA and 17 USMC WIA.

08 Oct At 081725H, An A.O. observed 8 to 10 freshly built 5.18' bunkers spaced over a distance of 150 meters. Bunkers were destroyed by Air.

09 Oct At 091700H, SNH reported that every vehicles sould be heard in the vicinity of XD 990693. Subsequent artillery mission resulted in one secondary explosion.

09 Oct At 091740H, SNG found 2 very fresh NVA bunkers at XD 981687. One bunker contained 6 82mm rounds with fuzes. Rounds and bunkers destroyed with demolitions.

10 Oct At 100925H, SNH reported that the enemy dead from the contact on G8 Oct at XD 987689 were left at the scene of the fire fight; 11 more NVA bodies and a .30 cal machinegum were found.

10 Oct At 101605H, SNG found 2 morter pits, 1 "A" frame bunker, a 550 cal machine gun position and 6 spent 50 cal rounds at XD 994695; All were destroyed.

11 Oct At 110925H, SNG discovered 38 152mm canisters and charges at XB 993693.

Rounds were in bunkers and well hidden.

11 Oct At 111015H, SNG found an additional 40 rounds of 152mm at XD 994694.

12 Oct At 121534H, SNF found a destroyed amphibious tractor at XD 997690a It had a 12 cylinder diesal engine with a winch on the rear. Presumably of USSR manufacture.

13 Oct At 13130CH, SHF found a trail runking past to southeast from XD 999697 to YD 003694. At YD 002695 they found 5 bunkers. Bunkers were destroyed.

15 Oct At 151130H, SN elements found 3 hage of 152mm increments, 14 hunkers, 19
RPG rounds, 13 82mm rounds, 400 rounds AK 47, 6 NVA gas masks, 1 danteem
and 4 granades at XD 976681. Destroyed all amunition and equipment with
demolitions.

25 Oct At 250001H, SNUB HOSE (BLT 2/26) call sign changed to WONDER WHY.

25-Oct At 250825H, WW "A" Command Group departed the LPH-5 for Cordon and Search
Operations (Operation RAGER HUNTER) in the A.O.A. prescribed by CTG 79.4.
Arrived 250835H.

25 Oct At 251050H, en A.O. working with WWE directed C.A.S. on 1 5 VC at BT 078629.

Direct hits with 250 lb bombs prevented at accurate body count. 1 VC KBA(C).

25 Oct At 251155H, WWE detained 5 adults, 1 teenager and 2 babies at BT 095657.
2 of the adults had no ID cards, all were female, all were detained.

25 Oct At 251300H, WWG detained 1 female at BT 109659. She was found to be listed on the 3d and 5th CIT Black List. She had \$9,275.20 VN on her person.

25 Oct At 25153CH, Operational Control of WW (BLT 2/26) passed to PANAMA HAT (1st Marines). WW commenced Operation GARRARD BAY.

26 Oct At 26103CH, WWH found 75 sheets of handwritten documents, mess gear, parts of NVA grandes and 3 sets of NVA uniforms at BT 097656. Documents and other gear was turned in to S-2; grande parts were blown in place.

26 Oct At 260930H, www was approached by 3 female adults carrying a fourth and 2 male children at BT 089653. The woman being carried had a gunshot wound in her right feet. One of the women had no ID card and her name was on the ITT Black List. ITT released the others without authorization from www or www.

One female detained forwarded to PH CP.

26 Oct At 261530H, WWF found a tunnel which had been previously booky trapped; booky trap-had-been removed. A 55 gal drum of rice was also found at BT 092658. The rice was scattered over a large area as a denial measure.

26 Oct At 262345H, a WWE LP was taken under fire by an unknown size enemy unit at BT 091647. Fire was returned and an Slmm mission was directed with unknown results. 2 USMC WIA (minor).

27 Oct At 270800H, WW helilift to Phong Ha (RT 072623) initiated.

27 Oct At 270600H, WWE found a kunker complex and 2 buts which appeared to be a rest area/mine factory at BT 058624. Also discovered 150 lbs of rice, assorted clothing and small articles. Destroyed in place.

27 Oct At 271220H, WWH found and searched 1 bunker and 3 straw hooches at BT 072625. Search revealed 3 100 1b bags of flour and 135 1bs of rice. Destroyed in place.

27 Oct At 271500H, WWH found 1 to 3 tons of rice hidden in veses and stone containers made up to look like grave sites. Three individual M-26 granades were employed as booky traps and 1 M-26 was booked up with a 105mm round at BT 065628. Booky traps and rice was destroyed.

27 Oct At 27163CH, WWG found 6 bunkers at BT 071620. Five of the bunkers were surrounded by spider holes. Bunkers and holes were destroyed. The bunkers had tin roofs and were lined with brick with semerate floors.

27 Oct At 271800H, WWF at BT 068625 found 2 booby trapped M-26 grenades. Pins were pulled and grenades placed in fruit cans with trip wires. Blown in place. A 25 lb box mine was found in the same vicinity. Pressure release device on mine was accidentially released detenating mine which resulted in 2 USMC WIA (medevaced).

28 Oct At 280110H, WWF at BT 065625 received 20 rounds of 82mm from BT 074632.

Counter mortar fires were conducted. Incoming resulted in 5 USMC KIA and 15 USMC WIA (medevased).

28 Oct At 280930H. WWF sollected 94 civilians at BT 066628, mostly middle aged women and children. One child about 6 years cld led a WWF element to a small cache of rice. About 90% of the collected civilians had ID cards.

28 Oct At 280930H, WWH sent 500 lbs of rice to be evacuated from LZ DEFEND. An additional 1000 lbs was destroyed as it was untransportable.

28 Oct At 281010H, WWF found 900 lbs of unbusked rice in urns at BT 066628. The rice was transported to LZ DEFEND for evacuation.

28 Oct At approximately 281200H, WW helflift to Tra Lo (BT 086682) was initiated.

29 Oct At 290930H, a mine was set off by WWG at BT 080690 resulting in 1 USMC KIA and 1 USMC WIA.

29 Oct At 291030H, WWH encountered 1 VN male at BT 087679. Individual had no ID Card. Sent to ITT at 2d Battalion, 1st Marines CP for interrogation.

29 Oct At 291030H, a mine was set off by WWG at BT 080690 resulting in 2 USMC WIA (medevased). 1 of the WIA's later died.

29 Oct At 291100H, WWE found 7 brick lined bomb shelters at BT 076682, medical supplies at BT 075681, 4 detainees at BT 074683, red flag with gold hammer and sickle and several documents at BT 076682. Bunkers were blown, medical supplies given to the AHVN's and detainees, flag and documents were sent to WW3's position.

29 Oct At 291100H, WWG found 2 teenaged VN males who had been killed by shrapnel at BT 084687. WMG had not fired arty or mortars in that area. Bodies were left at that position.

29 Oct At 29113QH, a Marine from WWF detonated a small booby trap at BT 065690 resulting in 1 USMC WIA (minor).

29 Oct At 291515H, WWF during cordon of Tra Khe II at BT 067683 detained 18 VN, 6 of whom appeared on the Black List. Detainees delivered to 2/1 LTT.

30 Oct At 301240H, a member of WWG at BT 080690 set off a M-26 booby trap resulting in 1 USMC WIA (medevaced).

31 Oct At approximately 310800H, WW elements were helilifted to the vicinity of Nui Kim Son (BT 073707) to conduct Cordon and Search of that village.

- (3) Postal Services: Mail service has been excellent with almost daily delivery to the troops in the field. Mail is initially sorted in the rear and couriered to the field for distribution.
- (4) Post Exchange: Post exchange facilities were available only to the Battalion Rear except during the period 19-25 October, when the Battalion Landing Team was backloaded aboard ship.
- (5) Special Services: Writing kits, games and sweatshirts were issued to all units. Special Services funds were used to purchase beer and soda for distribution to all personnel.


4. INTELLIGENCE

a. Enemy Situation at the Beginning of the Reporting Period. The suspected enemy units located within or adjacent to the operating area belonged to the 320th NVA Division. Elements of the 52d Regiment, 320th NVA Division were last reported as being located south of the Ben Hai River, within the southern boundary of the DMZ. The 48th Regiment, 320th NVA Division was thought to be located to the NW and West of the BLT 2/26 A.O. NVA artillery units were located just North of the Ben Hai River and also deep within the area of N. Vietnam. Although the location of two NVA artillery pieces (75mm Pack Howitzers) was known, the 130mm artillery locations remained undetected. The NVA units engaged by BLT 2/26 were also supported by a transportation unit, which did in fact, employ vehicles south of the Ben Hai River within the BLT 2/26 A.O. The vehicles were prime movers for 152mm artillery pieces, which were removed from the operating area, probably before insertion of BLT 2/26.

b. Enemy Initiated Incidents During the Reporting Period.

- (1) Contacts: During the reporting period there were 11 ground contacts, the most significant of which occurred on 08 October. During this engagement, H/2/26 killed a minimum of 28 NVA (C).
- (2) Suiper: During the reporting period there were 6 sniper incidents, all of which occurred while BLT 2/26 was OPCON to the 1st Marines.
- (3) Mines/Booby-Traps: While operating under the OPCON of the 1st LVT Battalion, in the area north of OCEAN VIEW (YD 292752), BLF 2/26 located and destroyed 4 booby-traps. During this same period, two AmTracs and one Tank detonated mines of an unknown type while operating in conjunction with BLT 2/26. During the reporting period in which BLT 2/26 was operating in the 1st Marines A.O., BLT 2/26 elements encountered 14 mines and 18 booby-traps. Of that total only four were detonated and inflicted casualties.
- (4) Artillery/Mortar Fire: During the reporting period, the enemy engaged BLT 2/26 with artillery on 12 occasions and with morter fire 5 times. Following is a recapitulation of the number of rounds and caliber. Also provided are locations of known artillery and mortar positions that fired upon PLT 2/26.



d. Significant Trends Noted During Reporting Period.

- (1) The enemy artillery positions and a suspected command and control complex located within the Southern boundary of the DMZ were defended by an estimated NVA Infantry Battalion (Rein). The infantry assumed a series of defensive positions that were easily defended by platoon sized units. These defensive positions were of the classic reverse—shope defense, well concealed with dense underbrush and heavily bunkered. The NVA fought initially against the BLT 2/26 in a defensive nature, employing Small Arms, Automatic Weapons, Mertars, Direct Fire flat trajectory weapons and Artillery. The initial NVA unit engaged (estimated company size) was a determined and well trained soldier, however, after intensive friendly supporting arms were brought to bear on the NVA positions, the enemy unit withdrew, only to take up a defensive posture once again in prepared positions.
- (2) The artillery gun pits and suspected command center was ringed with prepared mortar pits. It was noted that the majority of these positions were located to the rear and flanks of both the sommand center and gun pits. The mortar crews would often fire, move immediately to a new position, and remane firing.

e. Enemy Situation at the End of Period.

- (1) During the sweep along the coastal area above Cua Viet and Ocean View, no known enemy units were reported as being located within the BLT 2/26 A₀O.
- (2) The areas of Phong Ho II (BT 0662), to View Dong (BT 0965) and Nui Kim Son (BT 0770) are major infiltration routes for enemy units moving along the coastal area. Enemy units known to move within the area are the R 20 Local Force Battalion, the T-89 Sapper Battalion and the Q-86 (HOA VANG) Local Force Company. The presence of the T-89 Sapper Battalion within the BLT 2/26 A.O. was indicated by the number of mines and booby-traps encountered. Although no major ground contact was established with the R 20 Battalion, it is highly probable that it was that unit which mortared F/2/26 on 28 October during early morning hours.
 - f. Weather: The Weather during the 1st part of the reporting period was poor and a definite handicap to air operation. However, the weather changed and was good during the latter portion of the reporting period.



c. New Techniques.

- (1) During the period of operations on the Ben Hai River, the BLT found itself in a position wherein the enemy sould and did employ supporting arms to include general support artillery; in the defense of tactical positions. The most effective counter to the situation was to adopt a technique core frequently attributed to the NVA; that of operating cross-country and cross-comparement in order to take full advantage of the consealment afforded by the dense vegetation. It was found that the individual Maxine adapted well to this technique while the NVA never seemed to grasp the fact that the main attack and bulk of the BLT forces were not moving along the easier ground on the trace of the road being searched.
- (2) A second technique that is doubtless not new but one that proved sufficiently effective to warrant reaffirmation was that of locating LZ's remote from the command post or other positions. The LZ' acred to be a registration point for enemy artillery and, despite the additional effort and troop unit committment involved in man-carrying supplies, the remote location of LZ's was considered valid in that the enemy wasted many artillery missions searching for what he assumed to be positions in the vicinity of LZ's.
- (3) When enemy artillery or mortars did impast into a friendly position, no early attempts were made to medevas wounded unless the wounded were of the emergency category. It was noted early that much of the enemy artillery fire was brought to bear on areas that he suspected were resurised by BLT 2/25. In view of the fact that, for no apparent reason, the enemy would fire a few rounds into a terrain feature and then cease fire. It was felt that the esase fire perior was used to detect the approach of Medevas aircraft. Consequently, so long as the lives of individual Marines were not endangered, evacuation took place hours later, normally from an LZ remote from the point of injury. The enemy appeared weable to react quickly to the sudden appearence of Medevas aircraft in an unsuspected area and seems to have not associated the evacuations with his previous artillery missions.
- (4) The standard enemy defence ensumtered on the Ben Hal operation was a series of mutually supporting reverse slope bunkers covering more than one piece of defensible terrain. In one instance, the emple covered a series of three small hills astride the road being searched. When air strikes were initially employed on the first reverse slope it was noticed that the enemy resistance was not substantially





weakened despite the fact that ten flights, some armed with 750 lb bombs were committed. It was decided that the enemy, taking advantage of the thick vegetation and time lapse between the Aerial Observer's marking round and roll-in of the first attacking aircraft, were abandoning the positions and observing the air attack from the next rearward position. Accordingly, on the next day after detailed briefings of pilots and the Aerial Observer, air strikes were conducted on targets other than those marked by the Aerial Observer's rockets. Enemy resistance was noticeably and almost immediately reduced.

- (5) While hardly a new technique, it should be noted that the NVA defenders were particularly unmindful of the flanks or incapable of early detection and reaction to a flanking attack. On two separate occasions, the defenders were concentrating upon the secondary attack moving on the trace of the road and were completely suprised by attacks from the left and left rear. Whether this is an inherent weakness in NVA defensive doctrine or a reflection of our normal tendency to attack astride lines of communication cannot be accurately assessed.
- (6) Lastly, no new techniques were found when physically attacking fortified positions; however, mention should be made of the fact that the Marine Corps doctrinal method of attacking fortified positions remains sound. Flame throwers were not awailable to the BLT nor were satched charges. There is no substitute for the former, while grenades and field-manufactured devices were substituted for the latter. In all other respects, the bunkers were successfully attacked in accordance with Marine Corps Doctrine.
- d. Training. On-the-job-training was conducted by all elements of the BLT during the month. All rifle companies, the 81mm Morear Plt, Engineers and the 106mm RH Plt also received 2 hours of instruction on enemy mines and booby-traps presented by a 1st Engineer Battalion contact team.

e. Fire Support.

- (1) Artillery. From 1 October to 17 October, 1968, BLF 2/26 received artillery support from 1st Battalion, 12th Marines located at Camp Carroll.
 - (a) 165 H&I's were fired.
 - (b) 157 HE missions were fired.
 - (c) 4 Illumination missions were fired.
 - (d) 6 significant missions were fired during the period.

l At 032000H, Company G's F.O. called in a fire mission for prep fires at grid XD 979688 resulting in 7-8 secondary explosions.

2 At 041515H, Company E's F.C. called in a fire mission on active enemy mortar at grid XD 982682 resulting in excellent overage and mortar silenced.

- 3 At 05211CH, Company H's F.O. called in a fire mission on suspected enemy movement at grid XD 980699 resulting in 1 possible secondary and cessation of movement.
- 4 At 080030H, Company H's F.O. called in a fire mission on a suspected enemy position at grid YD 005696, resulting in 3 secondary explosions.
- 5 At 080100H, Company G's F.O. called in a fire mission on suspected active arty at XD 973704, resulting in 6 secondary explosions.
- 6 At 092130H, Company G's F.O. called in a fire mission on a known enemy position and prep fire at XD 987693, resulting in 6 secondary explosions.
- (2) From 25 to 31 October, 1968, the BLT received artillery support from 1st Bn, 11th Marines located at Da Nang.
 - (a) No H&I's were fired.
 - (b) 20 HE missions were fired.
 - (c) 3 Illumination missions were fired.
 - (d) There were no significant missions.
 - (3) 81mm Mortar Plt.
- (a) The Slmm Mortar Platoon supported the BLT throughout the period 1 to 17 and 25 to 31 October, 1968. The platoon was located at the BLT CP in the field.
 - 1 20 HE missions were fired.
 - 2 12 WP missions were fired.
 - 3 No illumination missions were fired.
 - 4 One significant mission was fired.
- a At 081530H, the plateon conducted a mission in support of Companies E and H at XD 994692. One enemy 60mm mortar was destroyed and the Plateon was credited with thwarting an attempted enemy counter-attack while inflicting numerous casualties upon the enemy force.
- (4) 106mm RR Plt. The Platoen supported the BLT during the period 27 to 31 October, 1968.
- (a) 8 rounds of HEAT and 8 rounds of HEPT were fired at an active enemy mortar site destroying two buildings.

f. Air Support. During October, BIT 2/26 made eight Battalion size helilifts consisting of Rifle Companies, the "A" Command Group, 81mm Mortar Platoon and the 106mm RR Platoon. Of these, six were tactical and two were administrative. The lifts involved 4,290 troops and over 80,000 lbs of cargo. Particularly note-worthy was the period 25 to 31 October during which BIT 2/26 made four tactical helilifts within seven days. Fixed Wing support was hampered by poor weather early in the month while the BIT was in the IMZ. During the latter part of the month, although good weather prevailed, extensive use of Fixed Wing support was precluded by the cordon and search missions assigned the BIT. As a result; only 33 Fixed Wing sorties were flown in support of the BIT. Offsetting this was the large number (80) of Aerial Observers, in support of the BIT. On several days Aerial Observation was provided almost continuously from 0700 to 1800. 163 troops were medewaced by helicopter during the month. The most significant single mission was the extraction of 20 personnel wounded by a mortar barrage during the night of 27-28 October. C-130 Flareships, AC-47 Flare/Gunships, Huey Gunships and UH-34D Medewac helicopters were all employed.

6. LOGISTICS.

a. Source of Supply and Maintenance. The source of supply and 3d/4th echelon maintenance support for the BLT during the period was FLSG-B Dong Ha and FLC Da Nang.

b. Status of Supplies.

- (1) During the reported period, the BLT underwent an extensive rehab of clothing and 782 gear. The source of rehab was organic supply, it was carried out on ARG Shipping.
- (2) Gas masks and upper body torso armor are no longer in oritical short supply. M-16 rifle cleaning rods are now available in moderate quantities.
- (3) There are still shortages of 2d echelon repair parts. This situation is compounded by a lack of SL-3 and SL-4 publications. These publications have been ordered however, the lead time required is approximately 3 months.
- (4) Resupply. Resupply was accomplished through Vandegrift; Class II and Medical Supplies were sent from Dong Ha to Vandegrift. Upon commencement of Operation EAGER HUNTER, initial resupply was accomplished from the USS PRINCETON. Upon completion of debarkation and establishment of the BLT Rear in Da Nang, resupply was accomplished by truck convoy to the forward elements or the Battalion.

c. Transportation.

- (1) Surface. Surface transportation was utilized to transport supplies from Dong Ha to Vandagrift and from Da Nang to the Pattalian forward position.
- (2) Air. Resupply was accomplished by helicopter from Vandegrift and the USS PRINCETON and Pad 23 Da Nang.





d. Service.

- (1) Water. The Battalion relied on water resupply by helicopter and surface transportation, natural sources were utilized when available.
- (2) Loundry. Facilities were available at Vandegrift and were utilized by BLT Support personnel. While embarked aboard ARC Shipping, facilities were utilized by all BLT personnel.
- (3) Food Services. The tactical elements of the Battalion subsisted mainly on "C" rations, supplemented by hot meals provided by host units. The rear elements of the Battalion subsisted in messes at Camp Carroll, Dong Ha and Da Nang. Cooks and messmen were provided as required.
- e. Maintenance. During the reporting period, the BLT underwent an extensive rehab of its Motor Transport, Ordnance, Engineer and Communication/Electronic equipment. This rehab was accomplished at the facilities of Maintenance Battalion, FLC Da Nang. During rehab, 1st and 2d echelon maintenance was certied out by BLT personnel. BLT personnel also assisted FLC personnel in 3d and 4th echelon maintenance.
- 7. CIVIL AFFAIRS. No Civil Affairs projects were conducted during the reporting period.
- 8. COMMUNICATIONS/ELECTRONICS.
- a. General. During the past month, the BLT Communications Platoon provided communications support for the BLT for Operations condusted during the reporting period.

b. Radio.

- (1) Constant radio communications were maintained between the BLT and Higher Headquarters, Rifle Companies and Supporting Arms. The Tactical Air Control Party continued using UHF and VHF radio equipment in the support of the BLT.
- (2) A covered radio circuit employing a KY-8 and a KY-38 was used for ciphered traffic to Higher Headquarters.
- c. <u>Vire</u>. A switching central was employed by the BLT aboard the USS PRINCETON (LPH-5) in order to provide communications between the BLT and SLF staffs. During operations ashore, wire communications was used sparingly due to the rapid movement of the BLT. Wire communications in the Alpha Command Group consisted of "hot lines" from supporting units to the Command Post. Upon landing the entire BLT on 27 October, a switching central with trunk lines to Force Logistics Command and units within the BLT was installed.
- d. Message Center. During the past month, a total of 2,458 messages were processed. Communisations Guard was maintained aboard the USS PRINCETON until 28 October and them was maintained by Force Logistics Command.

- e. Radio Relay. The two AN/TRC-27 terminals were not employed due to the deadlining of one RT-252.
- f. Maintenance and Supply. Upon reembarking, a Limited Technical Inspection was performed on all communications equipment that had been employed by the BLT when ashore. AN/PRC=25 accessories were received during the past month which temporarily allieviated the existing shortages. An RT=252 was placed on "Red Ball" in an attempt to remove the two AN/TRC=27 terminals from deadline.

9. MEDICAL SUPPORT.

- a. The BAS treated 911 patients during the month of October, 1968. Dr. G.R. ROWAN arrived on board 17 October, 1968 as Dr. G.S. PATRICK's relief.







- 1. Name and Type of Operation. Operation LANCASTER II TROUGHALE MORTH; a multi-Battalion Search and Beskroy Operation.
- 2. Inclusive Dates and Location. The Operation was conducted in the LANGASTER II Area of Operations during the parind 16 September to 1 October.
- 3. Command Headquarters. Location of the BLF Command Headquarters was LZ MARGO and Vicinity (XD 901611).
- 4. Task Organization. The following elements of BLF 2/26 were employed during this operation:

- 6. Mission. The mission assigned to the BLT 2/26(-) was to attack north in the Area of Operations, search out enemy locations, kill or capture the enemy, and capture or destroy his equipment and supplies. BLT 2/26(-) was also eventually ordered to seize Task Force Hotel Objectives 1 and 2.
- 7. Concept of Operation. On D-Day, following completion of scheduled ARCLIGHTS. BLT 2/26 attacked on a Northerly Axis in the assigned area of operations while 1st Bn, 4th Marines and 1st Bn, 9th Marines conducted simultaneous Heliberne assaults into the DMZ on the south bank of the Ben Hai River and attacked in a southerly direction.
- 8. Execution. At 160600H BIH 2/26 was placed under the Operational Control of 9th Marines and was given an order to withdraw to the south of grid line XD 62 from previously secured positions in order to previde a safety margin for AECLIGHTS that were conducted prior to the insertion of 1st Bn., 4th Marines and 1st Bn., 9th Marines. BMT 2/26 withdrew south to positions around violity of LZ MARGO (XD 901614). Company E and Marines around violity of LZ MARGO (XD 901614). Company E and Marines around to the BIH perimeter and began preparing positions when a heavy volume of 82mm mortar fire (approximately 158 rds.) was directed upon the BIH position. Counter-mortar and artillery missions were fired. At 1900H, a second barrage of 82mm was received on the positions, on this occasion 64 rounds were received. At 2030H movement was detected to the east of the position and multi-engine "gun aircraft" was directed on the area along with firing of appropriate defensive fires. This aircraft and relief aircraft were utilized throughout the night in an attempt to prevent enemy movement on the reverse slopes of the high ground that dominated the BIH position in LZ MARGO. The total casualties received as a result of enemy mortar fire on this date were 21 KIAs and 135 WIAs.

On 17 September the BIT again received incoming 82mm Mertar fire on two occasions. A total of 130 rds, were received. Eumerous patrols were conducted to deny close observation of the BIT's exact deployment. Additionally, after the last ARCLIGHT on 17 September, the BIT(-) was authorized to leave its positions in rear of the 62 grid line. Total casualties on 17 September as a result of enemy mortar fires were 1 KIA and 16 WIA's. At this time Company E was considered to be non-effective.

On 18 September, Co F and Co G continued the measurement northward that had started late on 17 September toward positions that had been ordered vacated on 15 September. The BLT CP and Cos E and H moved to XD 899617. At 1350H, Co G made the first contact at close range with a small sized enemy unit at XD 897627, after which the enemy immediately broke contact. At 1730H, Co G found an area at XD 896627 where the enemy had recently evacuated wounded and changed battle dressings. The blood and battle dressings were fresh; evidence pointing toward enemy casualties sustained the same day from either Co G's brief contact or supporting artillery fires in the area. At 2100H a Co G listening post at XD 897626 fired on 3-4 NVA at a distance of approximately 20 meters and withdrew to the perimeter. 3 Chi-Com granades were thrown by the enemy shortly thereafter and Co G fired small arms and threw frag granades in return. No casualties were sustained by Company G.

At 0745H on the 19th, Co F observed and fired on 2 NVA from a distance of 200 meters, with no casualties sustained by either side. At 0630H, Co F found

a bunker complex totaling 25 bunkers at YD 098632. At 1730E, Co F observed and fired upon 3 NVA at a distance of approximately 100 meters with unknown results. At 1900H, Co F received approximately 3 rounds of friendly artillery which resulted in 2 USEC KIA and 14 USEC WIA.

At 0600H on 20 September, Co G directed artillery fire on XD 892639 prior to continuing the northward movement. Eleven secondaries resulted from these fires. At 0900H, Co F fired on 5-10 NVA at XD 901639 at a distance of 100 meters. Two NVA KIA's, 2 AK-47s and one carbine were found. At 1630H, Co G discovered a company sized bunker complex and two mortar pits at XD 897639. At 1645H, Co G received automatic weapons fire at XD 891638 from NVA bunkered positions. Two Marines were wounded in the engagement. At 1630H, Co F found two large bunker complexes at XD 891635 and XD 891651 (TFH Obj. 2). Copius blood trails were also found in the area. Co F at XD 897640 and Co G at XD 891651 held positions during the night. Other elements of BLT 2/26 in the field remained in the vicinity of ND 899617.

At 1425H on 21 September, Cg.H. Lound 23 bunkers and 500 rounds of .50 caliber emmunition at XD 908633. At 1600H, Co G uncovered an ammunition cache at XD 891636 consisting of 11.475 .50 cal rounds, 705 82mm morter rounds, 60 RPG rounds, 320 AT Mines, and 10 cases of TMT. At 1645H, Co G came under automatic weapons and RPG fire from an estimated NVA platous as they reached the creat of hill 579 (TFH Obj. 1) at XD 892638. Contact was initiated by the NVA at close range. Co G returned fire with small arms and MG fire with an average distance of engagement of 15-20 meters. Co G then withdraw to permit use of artillery and 81mm mortar fires to be brought to bear on the enemy positions. Co G sustained 1 KIA and 4 WIA; while one enemy KIA was observed. At 1800H, Co G found a well used trail from XD 891635 to XD 891637. 17 bunkers and 30 fighting holes were also discovered and destroyed. Co F and Co G held night positions with no further contact.

On 22 September, Co H was moved northward to join Co F and Co G in attacking to the North. Co E remained behind to provide security for the BLT Cmd. Gp, the 81 mm mortar plt. and the LZ. At 1415H on 22 September, Co G found an extensive base camp at XD 890636. Facilities included 14 thatched huts, each with an adjoining bunkers, a dispensary; a messing area; and what appeared to be a GP area. Four more bunkers were found at XD 892639. At 1600H, Co F found 30 bunkers at XD 898638. Ces F_0G_0 and H held positions at mightfall.

On 23 September, Cos F_0C_0 and H continued sweep in a northerly direction without meeting any resistance or finding any enemy installations. Co E moved and continued parcelling around the LZ MARGO area,

On 24 September, Co F was re-deployed to cover the BLT rear and to provide security for the BLF CP group at XD 899617. Co E moved westward to continue the search and destroy mission with Cos G and H.





At 1600H on 25 September, Co E found 3 heavy machine gun positions with adjoining bunkers at XD 890620. Companies E, C, and H held positions at night and continued the Search and Destroy mission with no significant contact until 28 September at which time BLT 2/26(-) assumed a posture awaiting helilift to a new operating area. Since the actual move was delayed until Ol October, the BLT adopted a vigorous pregram of patrolling during the interim period to deny the area to the enemy. Actual change of Operational Control from 9th to 3rd Marines occurred at 1100H on the 1st of October. The helilift was concluded without incident.

9. Results.

(a) The following materials were seized from the enemy.



Also captured were small amounts of 782 gear, medicine, and documents.

(b) Both afternoon mortar attacks of 16 and 17 September were followed by infantry attacks that were quickly repulsed. Additional enemy movement, observed or heard, that was engaged with supporting arms, coupled with counter mortar fires are believed to have resulted in high enemy casualties. The terrain and vegetation precluded the finding of enemy bodies and attainment of any reasonably accurate body count.

10. Commander's Analysis.

- (a) The operation unquestionably destroyed the enemy's capability to use the operating area as a monsoon base. It is felt, based upon a liberal use of supporting arms on enemy positions, that a large portion of one enemy battalion was destroyed.
- (b) The ARCLIGHT safety factor, eg. 3000 meters that distated return of the entire BLT (-) to the confining terrain of LZ MARGO was considered excessive and in retrospect was unwarranted. Only a few of the ARCLIGHT bombs could be seen impacting from LZ MARGO and the latter ARCLIGHTS could barely be heard. It appears that the accuracy of the ARCLIGHT was underestimated when the safety distance was established or the area destructive effects were overestimated. In any event, it is strongly recommended that safety margins not be inflexibly levied but, rather, that the potential dangers of the tactical situation be given weight. An additional factor that apparently received little consideration was that of terrain. The terrain could have been utilized to shield BLT (-) units from ARCLIGHT effects and the then deployed units could have controlled the area in a fashion that would have reduced the casualty-inflicting mortar attacks.







11. Lessons Learned. No new tastics or techniques were developed.
