



Third Enhanced Landfill Mining Symposium (Lisboa, February 2016)

Lisboa hosts the Third International Symposium on Enhanced Landfill Mining (ELFM III) in February 2016. The Symposium, which is organised by the European Enhanced Landfill Mining Consortium (EURELCO), brings together leading ELFM academics, industry and public body representatives, as well as civil society actors to exchange and share their experiences and research results about all aspects of Enhanced Landfill Mining: the integrated valorisation of landfilled waste streams as materials and energy, while respecting the most stringent social and environmental conditions. ELFM III will have attention for both Urban Solid Waste landfills and monolandfills containing (critical) metal bearing industrial residues (tailings, sludges, slags etc.). ELFM III accommodates five sessions on topics that cover a wide range of areas such as innovative characterisation and monitoring of landfills, in situ and ex situ resource recovery techniques, policy and regulatory issues and spatial planning issues related to Enhanced Landfill Management and Mining. The deadline for on-line abstract submission is 30 April 2015.
