1- Why did citizens take the initiative to start up a 'Locals Work Group'?



- First ELFM symposium 2010 → The Locals
- Fourteen members \rightarrow critically examine \rightarrow project + reactions
- Information gathering meetings → trustworthy sources → past 7 years
- Follow and influence CtC project





2- Knowledge overcomes fear

- History \rightarrow dust, odour, nuisance, heavy traffic \rightarrow inhabitants \rightarrow suspicious
- The right to be concerned \rightarrow quality of life, health
- NIMBY syndrome \rightarrow no argument \rightarrow downplay the anxieties, to stigmatise
- Building knowledge → building credibility → building trust



3- A critical approach whilst being receptive to change







- Local population → protection of the environment, health, safety.
- Optimistic approach → obtain safeguards → ensure reliability (without causing nuisance, adverse effects in the short or long term)
- Transparency throughout the entire project > follow-up, controllability.
- Big challenge!



4- Participation without insight leads to utterance without perspective.' (part 1)



- "Inspraak zonder inzicht leid tot uitspraken zonder uitzicht!"
- \blacksquare Well-founded agreement / no agreement \rightarrow clear understanding \rightarrow essentially
- Critical stance → authorities / businesses → convince society → just benefits
- Principles of 'The Locals':
- \blacksquare Knowledge about the project \neq immediately agree
- Local residents agreement → understand what will happen → here and how

(Including technologies and processes)





4- Participation without insight leads to utterance without perspective.' (part 2)

- Do understand + not agree → clearly justify opinion
- Knowledge + insights → well founded objections → described precisely
- Education institutions, scientists, business leaders → likely to listen → clearly formulated objections
- Politicians → interest
- Very important task \rightarrow work together \rightarrow scientific community \rightarrow translate complex information \rightarrow understandable for general public





5- The driving force that kept 'The Locals' going for more than seven years



- - Public → objective scientific knowledge → fully informed decisions, conclusions.
 - Proposals → project managers → adjustments (Early warning system, test excavations, ...)
- Results → public The Locals = neutral actor
- $ELFM \rightarrow$ opportunity \rightarrow final chapter
- Ultimately → end of old form of waste processing
