

In addition to the prestigious Bill Fiscus Award, our Association won the top *Outstanding Alumni Association & House Corporation Communication Awards* for (1) *Printed Newsletters*, (2) *Electronic Newsletters*, and (3) *Websites*. These awards recognize groups that excel in communicating their messages to specific audiences and are given for content, design and layout; effectiveness of message; and production quality.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



I can't remember exactly how long it's been, but my best guess is I've been President of the ΣAE Alumni Association for close to 25 years. During that time we have accomplished a lot, capping it off with the *Bill Fiscus Award for the Outstanding Area Alumni Association*, and three other top National

awards, which we just received.

In addition he has chaired Founders' Day for the last several years and is well known to the staff at Fraternity HQ. Adam has also been President of the Mission Valley Sunset Rotary Club. I feel he is well qualified to take over from me in January 2016 and I strongly support his candidacy.

To insure a smooth transition, I plan to stay on the Board for at least another year.

The election of Association Officers and Directors will take place in December and there will be several openings, we need to fill.

We meet for breakfast once a month, which isn't a big demand on anyone's time. It has been the Board's goal to encourage greater participation by younger members, regardless of chapter. That is not to say we discourage "grey haired" Brothers, such as myself. If you are interested in serving, please let me know.

It has been a great pleasure to serve as your President (most of the time), but now it's time to "pass the torch".

It is hard to imagine that on March 9, 1856, as Noble Leslie DeVotie and seven young men gathered at the University of Alabama to form a new fraternity, they could have predicted the phenomenal growth of our Noble Order.

Today, Sigma Alpha Epsilon has a presence on nearly 240 campuses with almost 15,000 collegiate members across the country. DeVotie had a simple motive — to perpetuate friendship. Indeed, it is friendship that brings us together and brotherhood that binds us together. And so, as I begin my two-year term as Eminent Supreme Archon, I invite you to join me on this incredible journey over the course of the next biennium.

As ESA, I will work with the Supreme Council to focus on five specific priorities:

Seek Input: Listening is a key component of leadership and, as such, I will make it a priority to reach out and listen to the ideas, suggestions and priorities of students and alumni alike to ensure we are meeting the priorities of the Realm.

Streamline the Student Experience: A student's time is his most precious resource. With that in mind, we need to take the time to review, evaluate and streamline carefully the important education, training and certification programs the Fraternity offers to ensure they are meaningful, impactful and user-friendly.

Double the Number of Alumni Volunteers: While the Fraternity boasts more than 200,000 living alumni, only a fraction of these individuals are engaged as volunteers. We must launch a comprehensive campaign to recruit the next generation of alumni volunteers and leaders. Increased alumni involvement will provide

critical support to our chapters and increase giving to the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation.

Reduce Our Exposure to Risk: If we consider today's student who is graduating with an average of \$30,000 in debt, we must ensure that finances are not a barrier to membership. To accomplish our assistance to him, we must provide tools and resources to reduce our exposure to risk in an effort to continue to drive down the cost of the health & safety fee.

Roadmap for Success: To move forward as a team, my first priority as ESA will be to bring our stakeholders together to launch a new three-year strategic plan for the Fraternity. The planning process will be organic in nature and will provide an opportunity for input from every student and alumnus to chart a clear course and common vision for our future.

Every great organization faces triumph and tragedy and, certainly, Σ AE is no exception. The key to enduring success, however, is to learn and evolve as a result of the challenges we face, to ensure we remain relevant and vital for future generations of brothers.

I left the 159th Anniversary Convention in Newport Beach inspired by the enthusiasm of our collegiate members and the loyalty of our dedicated alumni. And I am confident that our best days lie ahead.

BRO PRO-FILES: GREG TERRAZAS (CA-CH '07) - BY DAVID ROBINSON

Greg Terrazas Advises and Volunteers



When Greg Terrazas arrived at UCSD as a freshman in 2002, he wasted no time in finding a fraternity with which to affiliate. “I wanted the full experience and didn’t want to wait,” he said. “So I talked to a few other students about which fraternities had the best reputation, met with some of the ΣAE (Cal Chi) Brothers and then went to a couple of

their rush events. I pledged that fall.”

As an undergrad, Greg was his chapter’s rush chair and risk manager, as well as a delegate to the 2003 national convention in Cleveland.

He also joined the UCSD rugby team, which was a “club sport” at the Division I level. “I was curious about the sport and went to some practices,” Greg said. “I had no experience, but team members and coaches were supportive and willing to show the basics to an inexperienced freshman. I really liked the game, gradually improved and was on the team all four years at UCSD.”

Rugby provided a special bond, as more than 15 UCSD players were ΣAEs during that period. Their participation offered some comfort when the ΣAE chapter lost its charter in 2005 (regaining it in 2012). “Being on the team was another way to stay connected with some of the Brothers.”

His rugby experience also inspired a special post-graduation plan. “For several years, three other Brothers who played rugby and I had been planning a backpack trip,” he explained. Upon graduation in 2007, they spent five months backpacking in New Zealand, Australia, Thailand, Cambodia, Nepal, Morocco and Spain. “We stayed with some people we met along the way as well as at hostels and campgrounds. One of the highlights was a 30-day hike through the Annapurna Circuit in the Himalayas. We all got along well and it was a great trip.”

When he returned to the U.S. in June 2008, Greg considered looking for a job in the finance field, which he was interested in partially because of a familiarity with his parents’ professions. (His father was a loan officer and his mother was a CPA.) However, the economic crisis limited the opportunities. “There weren’t many openings then, so I decided to move to Vail Resorts in Colorado for the winter seasons. I taught slope cycle (scooter with bottom like a skateboard) and ski biking (a bicycle with mini skis) and later worked in the corporate office.”

Still interested in the finance profession, Greg relocated to Orange County two years later and began informally counseling some of his friends and family members. “I was upset that so many people had lost money or otherwise had problems and I offered some very basic suggestions, based on what I had learned from my parents, as well as various college/extension courses.”

He obviously was primed to start his financial services career and a return to San Diego, which he did in 2012. He joined Pollakov Financial and then Allen Financial Advisement, where he currently is a financial services representative. “My team and I provide advice for individuals, families and small businesses; helping them set and achieve their financial objectives.”

Greg definitely feels he made the right choice. “I get great satisfaction when clients see the return on their investments or accomplish other objectives, and by meeting such interesting people and developing great relationships.”


He also is busy in other areas—volunteering as an assistant coach with the UCSD rugby team and as a member of the UCSD Alumni Leaders Club, which organizes events for San Diego area graduates. In addition, Greg assists non-profit organizations, including the Jonathan Tarr Foundation that provides scholarships and other support to low income youth. “Our ΣAE chapter did a lot of philanthropy and I’ve always been interested in giving back,” he said.

Of course, he finds time to keep in touch with his ΣAE bros. “Some of my best friends are those from the fraternity and I am in contact with a lot of them. I enjoy attending the Association events and developing friendships with Brothers from other chapters.”

- There was Epsilon Eta, which was established nearly 100 years ago.

New ΣAE in San Diego History Project Needs Your Inputs (Cont.)

ΣAE's new members are "encouraged" to learn the rich history of their fraternity: the founding brothers, first chapter house at the University of Alabama, the Civil War years, the special traditions and so much more.

However, most of us know much less about our local history. For example, it's important to know that we can trace our history to Epsilon Eta, the first fraternity at what was then known as San Diego Normal School. That a group of eight forward looking young men applied for affiliation with Sigma Alpha Epsilon, with the encouragement of ΣAE brothers from other chapters who had relocated to San Diego. Where were Cal Theta's earlier fraternity houses located? How and when did those massive lions appear at our front door?

So we thought it was important to create a formal history of our fraternity in San Diego. This is a broad overview of the highlights from 1921 to 2015: from the birth of Epsilon Eta to the formation of three chapters of ΣAE—and much more.
