

The Association enjoyed another very successful year, thanks to the 182 of you, who supported us by paying your membership dues. This allowed us to once again cover the Leadership School tuition for two undergrads each from San Diego State, Cal State San Marcos and University of California San

Diego. Also we were able to continue with our various events which, for the most part, are subsidized by the Century Club members.

This was the first year the Board of Directors was elected by a vote of the entire membership and we recently completed our second election, adding Gary Keehner (WA-AL '62) to the Board. We established five working committees (see Page 9) and have ambitious goals for expanding the activities of the Association.

Volunteers for these committees would be most welcome.

Regardless of how we do it for now, invoices will be sent out shortly, rather than relying on the Founders' Day mailing.

## VOICE OF THE ESA



### GREETINGS, BROTHERS!

A lot has taken place since our last issue. Sigma Alpha Epsilon is well underway in implementing the new True Gentleman Experience, or TGE, which has replaced the pledging process. I am excited to report that our 15,000 undergraduate brothers have adapted to the change exceptionally well

and that this initiative has been receiving rave reviews from university administrators, the media, our insurance carriers, parents and alumni and collegiate members alike.

Since we announced the launch of the TGE on March 9, 2014, we have initiated more than 5,500 brothers. Grades for the Spring 2014 semester have increased across the board, and the number of reported incidents has been curtailed. Recruitment numbers for this Fall 2014 semester are higher than the same period last year. Even universities and IFCs are starting to follow  $\Sigma$ AE's lead by requiring their Greek-letter system to eliminate pledging.

This issue of The Record focuses on recruitment, the bloodline of our Fraternity. As this issue goes to print, nearly 325,000 brothers have been initiated into Sigma Alpha Epsilon since our founding in 1856. When I joined the Supreme Council nine years ago, we had 7,500 undergraduate brothers. Past Eminent Supreme Archon Todd Buchanan launched the "Be the One" campaign during his tenure, and its effects have had a profound impact on our organization. We recently reached an all-time high of 15,000 undergraduate members.

In today's fraternity environment, no one individual can be expected to recruit for the entire chapter. Each brother needs to go out and find one friend and recruit him each recruitment period. In addition, alumni have a significant impact on recruitment efforts, and I encourage you to attend a chapter's recruitment event. College students are looking for a safe place to belong, a place to share friendship and brotherhood and a place to have fun and utilize our enormous network of alumni to assist them with networking after graduation. Sigma Alpha Epsilon offers all of these

opportunities and much more to today's college students.

Under the True Gentlemen Experience, we are finding that more students are interested in  $\Sigma$ AE than during any point in the past decades. Those men who hold leadership positions on campus, college athletes and scholars likely would not have been interested in Sigma Alpha Epsilon prior to the changes we made. Now, they see the opportunity to join without their membership adversely impacting their existing activities on campus, and they are joining our chapters. They no longer have to endure a six-week, ten-week or longer intensive and time-consuming pledge program, but rather have the opportunity to learn everything about our Fraternity, our glorious history, traditions, Ritual, leadership, community service and brotherhood over the course of their collegiate tenure.

As I have said many times, Sigma Alpha Epsilon is not just about a pledge program or even our undergraduate experience. Sigma Alpha Epsilon is a lifelong experience. While I realize the changes we made as the Fraternity's leaders were controversial at first, I am reassured to find that  $\Sigma$ AE is thriving and growing again. We are bigger, stronger and safer than we have ever been. Gentlemen, our brightest days are still ahead.

## **BRO PRO-FILES: GARY KEEHNER (WA-AL '62) - BY DAVID ROBINSON**

### ***Gary Keehner Gives Back to SAE, Others***



Gary Keehner first became acquainted with  $\Sigma$ AE 55 years ago while in pre-dental studies (Zoology major) at the University of Washington (Wash. Alpha). "I pledged as a junior in 1959 and lived in the fraternity house where I worked in the kitchen for room and board," he said. "Later I also served as Chapter Chaplain."

After attending dental school for a year, Brother Keehner decided becoming a dentist

wasn't the best career choice. Upon graduation with a Zoology degree in 1962, he worked at the Dow Chemical and Memorex Corporations. But interested in expanding his future opportunities, Gary decided to pursue a chemistry degree at San Jose State University. "I thought this would eventually open more employment doors," he said.

The chemistry degree gave Gary the added background necessary for a new job with Hewlett Packard (HP) where he would spend his 41-year career. He began working as a salesman of HP's specialized lab equipment used to perform chemical analysis at hospitals, universities, drug testing labs, environmental and other facilities. However, he was soon appointed Regional Analytical Manager for sales, service and technical support in the 11 Western states, Alaska and Hawaii; based in North Hollywood and later in San Diego. He was able to combine his education with sales and technical expertise. "Having the chemistry background enabled me to look at specific problems that scientists and others were facing and help design solutions," he explained.

In addition to overseeing the sales and support staff, Gary had the opportunity to be involved with some interesting applications. "For example, I was the HP management point person for the UCLA drug testing lab at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles. And during the 1995 America's Cup in San Diego, I was on the HP sponsorship committee that supported the A3 women's crew."

Gary retired in 2008, but wasn't ready to slow down. He was soon participating in a wide range of

organizations, including the Professional Men's Society of La Jolla, USC San Diego Trojan Club, Scripps Institution of Oceanography, The Village Church in Rancho Santa Fe, and the San Diego Rock and Roll Marathon. "Giving back is important to me. I learned that early on from observing my parents helping within their community."

He also reconnected with  $\Sigma$ AE. "I really enjoyed my experience as an undergrad. When I moved to California and got busy with my career, I didn't have sufficient time to spend with  $\Sigma$ AE alumni groups. Then in 2000, I received a call from a San Diego investment company representative and during our conversation learned that we were both  $\Sigma$ AEs. He told me about the high energy, well-run San Diego Alumni Association and its President, Dick Troncone. I decided to join and have been involved ever since."

Gary attended his first  $\Sigma$ AE luncheon and then became a regular at the lunch programs, Founders' Day and other functions. In addition to helping out at various events, he was recently elected to the San Diego Alumni Association Board of Directors. "I love the camaraderie and the chance to contribute to the Association," he said. He is also a regular donor to the national  $\Sigma$ AE Foundation.

Gary's busy retirement schedule also includes helping to take care of his 95-year old mother-in-law. His other outside interests have included extensive traveling with his wife, Irene; their annual Maui vacation with son Shane and daughter Laura; reading; tending his rose garden; and until recently, playing tennis and running. "I was a good tennis player and won the University of Washington Intramural Tennis Championship in 1960," he said. "However, my knees gave out running 10K races and playing tennis, so the La Jolla Beach and Tennis Club membership now only includes the beach activities."

As Brother Keehner starts his new role on the Alumni Association Board, he is glad to have reestablished his ties with  $\Sigma$ AE 15 years ago and emphasizes that it's never too late to become a member. "The time was right to be associated with my fraternity again. I look forward to many more years of enjoying time with the Brothers."

### SDSU Coaches Featured at the October 21st Luncheon - Special Report by John McMullen



**SDSU Coaches Brian Dutcher & Steve Fisher with SDSU Professor Emeritus Cliff Bee (MI-DE '61)**

Aztec Basketball Coach Steve Fisher has been a part of our Alumni Association since his arrival on the SDSU campus in 1999. Approximately a dozen of our association members are Aztec basketball season ticket holders. Accordingly, we have invited Steve to be our luncheon speaker every year since he arrived. He has accepted every year. But, in 2013 he called me the day before the luncheon to cancel his appearance, so he could fly to Phoenix and hold the hand of recruiting prospect (now an Aztec) Zylan Cheatham. He graciously offered up the Aztec "Head Coach in Waiting" Brian Dutcher, who wowed the 50 or so brothers assembled at the luncheon. Coach Fisher had become so much a regular speaker, at our luncheons, that 6 or 8 years ago we presented him with an SAE sweatshirt and made him an "honorary SAE Pledge".

This year, on October 21st, we had Coach Fisher scheduled for the 14th time. Days before the luncheon we were advised that both Fisher and Dutcher would speak to our group. The brothers were excited for the presentation, to hear how the coaches would distribute the playing time to all of their new recruits and especially who was going to be doing the scoring, after the loss of point/shooting guard Xavier Thames, to graduation.

Brother Cliff Bee, as always, did the introduction of Coach Fisher and Coach Dutcher and how they have been together since 1988, at Michigan. The two of them have led their teams to 14 NCAA tournaments and 20 total post-season tournaments.

Coach Fisher was the first to speak and he talked about how well he and Brian work together to instill a family spirit within the team. The long-term commitment that the two of them have made has added stability to the "team" and helped enhance the visibility and reputation of SDSU. They have progressively gained success both in the conference and on a national level with NCAA Tournament successes. They expect to continue to be in the Tournament and hopefully improve on their Sweet Sixteen accomplishments.

This year the big questions are (1) who and how will the talented recruiting class and transfer, Angelo Chol blend with the returning players? And (2) who will step up and be the "go to" guy when a basket must be made. Last year that guy was Xavier Thames. But, who will it be this year? Coach believed that upon their return from the Maui Invitational Tournament in November they would have a good sense of "who we are?"

Coach Dutcher began by talking about how the team has changed over the years. In recent years the team succeeded largely based on the strength of the transfer students that made huge contributions on the floor. A few are still part of the team, JJ O'Brien; Dwayne Polee, Aqeel Quinn and Angelo Chol. But over the last couple of years they are recruiting top freshman players like Winston Shepard, Matt Shrigley, Skylar Spencer, D'Erryl Williams and Dakari Allen. And this year Trey Kell, Kevin Zabo, Zylan Cheatham and Malik Pope. The ability to draw these top freshmen speaks to the strong national perception of the SDSU team. How they mold and manage these talents into a cohesive team will determine the strength of that image, down the road. As coaches they are confident. While Coach Fisher spoke of the view they will have about the team, upon their return from Hawaii, Coach Dutcher believes the nationally televised game against Utah, November 18th, will be telling.

As I write this we are in the last days of December. We won the game against Utah and played well in Hawaii, playing #2 ranked Arizona for the championship, but losing. As a fan, what's been particularly maddening about this talented roster is that they have been consistently ineffective on offense. They are always strong on defense. Early in the season Aqeel Quinn surprised everyone by leading the team in scoring and becoming a valuable team leader. He recently missed a

few games, due to a broken finger. He returned for the last two games and has looked like he might become the “go to” shooter, scoring 18 points against UC Riverside. Winston Shepard has become more consistent scoring, but turns the ball over too frequently. Sophomores Williams and Allen are earning more minutes by making good contributions. Freshman point guard Trey Kell has shown signs of a budding star, but is also displaying the inexperience of a freshman. Malik Pope is also becoming a more consistent scorer. Zylan Cheatham has not played, due to injury and will be redshirted.

In the UCR game our “super sixth man” Dwayne Polee collapsed on the floor, where he remained for 15 minutes, before leaving the arena in an ambulance. He is currently back with the team but many questions remain to be answered about the cause of his collapse. For now and the foreseeable future, he will not play

with the team. So some of these players I mentioned will be seeing more minutes to try and fill the void.

To fix their offensive woes, as we head into conference play on December 31st. the coaches have started feeding JJ O’Brien inside and letting him direct the offense, by choosing to pass it out to the perimeter, turn and drive to the basket or shoot a close in jumper. This seems to have helped the offensive flow as well as making JJ a much better offensive player, from my view.

Coaches Fisher and Dutcher appear to be comfortable with their early season’s tweaks and we will likely see the usual eight man bench that Fisher is known for, as we proceed into the meat of our schedule. GO AZTECS...I believe that we will win!

Dick was recognized for his architectural contribution to the City & County. In addition to designing the Cal Theta ΣAE house (with Carl Hotten) and trying to help **Gary Losey (CA-TH ’79)** & **“Mad Dog” Matson (CA-TH ’70)** with the current interiors, Dick designed the Visitor Information Center, Peninsula Bank of Pt. Loma (now U.S. Bank), the Miramar MCAS

Officer’s Club, most of the buildings at Pt. Loma Nazarene University as well as U.S. Int’l. University (now Alliant Int’l. University). He has also designed or monitored projects in London, France, Nairobi, Kenya, Hawaii, Mexico City, Japan – all together totaling some 300 other buildings.

When asked, Brother Lareau stated, “My architectural practice has been more fun than work. I would recommend an architectural career to anyone intrigued by the arts & sciences.”

Annual Holiday Party Held on Dec. 19th at the Sheraton Harbor Island West Hotel






