# VOICE OF THE ESA



It is hard to imagine that on March 9, 1856, as Noble Leslie DeVotie and seven young men gathered at the University of Alabama to form a new fraternity, they could have predicted the phenomenal growth of our Noble Order.

Today, Sigma Alpha Epsilon has a presence on nearly 240 campuses with almost 15,000 collegiate members across the country. DeVotie had a simple motive — to perpetuate friendship. Indeed, it is friendship that brings us together and brotherhood that binds us together. And so, as I begin my two-year term as Eminent Supreme Archon, I invite you to join me on this incredible journey over the course of the next biennium.

As ESA, I will work with the Supreme Council to focus on five specific priorities:

**Seek Input:** Listening is a key component of leadership and, as such, I will make it a priority to reach out and listen to the ideas, suggestions and priorities of students and alumni alike to ensure we are meeting the priorities of the Realm.

**Streamline the Student Experience:** A student's time is his most precious resource. With that in mind, we need to take the time to review, evaluate and streamline carefully the important education, training and certification programs the Fraternity offers to ensure they are meaningful, impactful and user-friendly.

**Double the Number of Alumni Volunteers:** While the Fraternity boasts more than 200,000 living alumni, only a fraction of these individuals are engaged as volunteers. We must launch a comprehensive campaign to recruit the next generation of alumni volunteers and leaders. Increased alumni involvement will provide critical support to our chapters and increase giving to the Sigma Alpha Epsilon Foundation.

**Reduce Our Exposure to Risk:** If we consider today's student who is graduating with an average of \$30,000 in debt, we must ensure that finances are not a barrier to membership. To accomplish our assistance to him, we must provide tools and resources to reduce our exposure to risk in an effort to continue to drive down the cost of the health & safety fee.

**Roadmap for Success:** To move forward as a team, my first priority as ESA will be to bring our stakeholders together to launch a new three-year strategic plan for the Fraternity. The planning process will be organic in nature and will provide an opportunity for input from every student and alumnus to chart a clear course and common vision for our future.

Every great organization faces triumph and tragedy and, certainly,  $\Sigma$ AE is no exception. The key to enduring success, however, is to learn and evolve as a result of the challenges we face, to ensure we remain relevant and vital for future generations of brothers.

I left the 159th Anniversary Convention in Newport Beach inspired by the enthusiasm of our collegiate members and the loyalty of our dedicated alumni. And I am confident that our best days lie ahead.



## **BRO PRO-FILES: GARY MARTIN (CA-TH '81) - BY DAVID ROBINSON**

### ***Gary Martin's Career Took Him Across Country and Back to San Diego***



When Gary Martin arrived on the SDSU campus in 1978, he soon realized the value of a large social network. The freshman from Chula Vista lived in an off-campus apartment and like so many other students, was anxious to meet more of his classmates. "One day I saw an old friend from high school who mentioned that he had joined  $\Sigma$ AE," Gary recalled. "I didn't know anything about fraternities but decided to rush—only  $\Sigma$ AE. As soon as I walked through the front door of the Cal Theta house, my life changed. From knowing very few people on a 35,000 student campus, I was soon acquainted with several hundred."

Gary not only enjoyed an enhanced social life but also got involved in the fraternity, serving as Cal Theta's pledge trainer, treasurer and then EA.

Graduating in 1981 with a Business/Information Systems degree, Gary was ready to jumpstart his career. "Sales had always been my objective, with a focus on getting into the business computer profession," he explained. "The PC industry was expanding in the early 1980s and my degree helped me get on the ground floor." His first stop was with Control Data Corp. in Sunnyvale, Calif. "I was fortunate to get a good job with a great company right out of college."

Brother Martin subsequently took a career detour when he realized another goal—working as a stockbroker in Boise, Idaho. A few years later, he returned to the computer industry, receiving an attractive offer to join Seagate Technology (hard disc drive manufacturer), first in Orange County and later in Georgia and North Carolina. "This was a major career boost. I managed the company's important IBM account and was eventually promoted to global sales director."

During his tenure with Seagate, Gary participated in Harvard University's Director's Leadership program and various training courses in strategic selling, negotiations, statistical analysis and presentation skills.

"For 20 years, I enjoyed a good career in a high growth industry; enabling me to travel the world, work with people of different cultures and develop great relationships," he said.

When the high tech market slumped in 2009, Gary adapted and found a new place in the wellness industry, as director of business development for startup RivalHealth. He applied the same business development skills that had made him successful in previous positions. But he also was receptive when a fraternity brother offered him a chance to return to San Diego last year—to join NetApp, a data storage company. "It was good to be back and reconnect with extended family members and friends, and attend Aztec games again."

Gary also had the chance to volunteer on the  $\Sigma$ AE Alumni Association's Board of Directors; assisting with both new member development and chapter support. "I'm anxious to help expand the Association's membership. I want to see more of my contemporaries and other alumni get involved; attending events and offering support."

When not busy with work or his Alumni Association responsibilities, Gary enjoys playing golf and traveling with his wife Cynthia, including visits with their four children, and stops at micro-breweries around the country. He also welcomes the occasions to see the fraternity brothers he first met as a young SDSU student. "The fondness  $\Sigma$ AEs have for each other is evident as we get together," he emphasized. "Becoming a member of Cal Theta provided me with the camaraderie I wanted; a lifetime of friends."

## February Luncheon Featuring San Diego Mayor Kevin Faulconer Held



At our February 23rd luncheon, we were honored to have San Diego Mayor Kevin Faulconer as our guest speaker.

A record number of Brothers heard Mayor Foulconer summarize his accomplishments since taking office, which include directing 50 percent of all new major revenue toward neighborhood improvements; doubling the miles of streets repaired annually; hiring the first female police chief in San Diego history; improving emergency response times in underserved neighborhoods; increasing hours at libraries and recreation centers to their highest level in a decade; creating a year-round indoor homeless shelter for families and veterans that replaced temporary outdoor winter tents; negotiating a

five-year agreement with police officers to address recruitment and retention problems; helping innovative companies grow and expand right here in San Diego, and bringing a customer-service attitude to city government.

“On behalf of the Museum and all of its talented employees and volunteers, it is a privilege to be recognized by the San Diego Business Journal along with the noteworthy leaders who make such a critical impact in our region,” said Brother Kidrick. “I am delighted to represent the San Diego Air & Space Museum and our entire team, including staff, Board Members, donors, volunteers, and everyone who supports the Museum. This is really a team award, which is fitting since our Museum specializes in telling the stories of great teams of men and women who have powered the growth of flight and space exploration throughout history.”

The San Diego Business Journal’s 2016 Most Admired CEO Awards recognizes local industry leaders’ achievements within their companies and in the community. The winners and finalists are lauded for demonstrating determination and insight yielding successes for their organizations. Nominees were judged in the categories of nonprofit organization, business nonprofit, education, family-owned business, government agency, privately held company, and public company.

## SDSU Athletic Director to Speak at April 5th Association Luncheon

Mark your calendars for the next Association Luncheon to be held on Tuesday, April 5th at the San Diego Yacht Club, when our speaker will be SDSU Athletic Director, Jim Sterk.



Jim Sterk enters his sixth season as San Diego State University's Director of Intercollegiate Athletics, having already left an indelible mark on San Diego State. He has overseen the most successful five seasons in San Diego State athletic history. In terms of on-the-field accomplishments, the Aztecs have won 32 conference team championships since the beginning of the 2011-12 academic year, and in the classroom there have been a record-number of scholar-athletes on the Mesa. In addition, Sterk oversaw SDSU's fundraising campaign this past season which once again eclipsed the previous record.

In terms of competitive success, San Diego State continues to set itself apart, compiling the fourth-highest combined winning percentage in the country in football and men's basketball since the beginning of the 2010-11 season at 75.2% [182-60]

To recognize Sterk's success, he has been named a 2015-16 Athletic Director of the Year. The honor comes from the National Association of Collegiate Director of Athletics [NACDA]. This award "highlights the efforts of athletics directors at all levels for their commitment and positive contributions to student-athletes, campuses and their surrounding communities." Sterk, is one of only four AD's honored at the Football Bowl Subdivision level.
