Just wanted to check in with all of you to ask:

Are any foundations paying for ongoing teachers? Our situation might be unique, but we have four regular periods in the school day and a fifth period for Conservatory (three days a week).

Typically our Conservatory teachers will teach two day time periods and then fifth period as their full contract. However, we have had some cases where they teach three day periods AND fifth for a total of four teaching periods. In the past, we have been asked to pay an hourly rate for the EWA for that additional period, but now the district and union agreed to pay the fourth class at full pay, with benefits, etc.

Our prior Principal, Brian Kohn had told me during my first year, that under no circumstances should foundations pay for ongoing teacher salaries. There is apparently history about this in other districts that preceded me where foundations/districts got in some trouble with the press for this practice.

Any insight you can offer on whether you have or currently do, pay any ongoing teacher salaries?
