

August 14





“Summer Brain Drain” is a concern for parents and teachers alike. According to a program at Johns Hopkins University, when kids aren’t engaged in summer learning,

they risk losing “the equivalent of two months’ worth of grade-level math and reading skills”. (National Center for Summer Learning).

I’ve been pondering how we might find ourselves experiencing a church equivalent of “summer brain drain.”

It’s no accident that the liturgical color for these Sundays after Pentecost is green. This is a season for growing as disciples of Jesus Christ as we put down spiritual roots, and “leaf out” into new questions and prayer practices that draw us closer to the Sun (and the Son).

Yet, these summer months naturally bring disruption to our regular patterns for church worship and prayer. Opportunities for cabin time, family reunions, and vacation trips during school breaks are precious, and not to be missed!

If weekly worship is our primary opportunity for hearing scripture and having our faith fed, we can experience a sort of spirit drain (as well as brain drain). We can feel less connected with our church family, too.

So, how might you intentionally engage in summer learning and grow in faith this summer?

Here are a few ideas to consider:

- 1) **Worship on Vacation!** Look for a local congregation near your cabin or vacation spot. One easy way to do this is the “Find a Congregation” tool on the ELCA’s website: www.elca.org.
- 2) **Travel with the Zion Sermon Podcast:** Use your smartphone’s Podcast app to locate the “Zion

Lake Crystal Sermons” podcast, and you’ll be able to hear the gospel reading and sermon for each week’s worship service.

- 3) **Pray and read scripture daily**, using a devotional you’re already comfortable with or try a new resource. Print copies of *Christ in our Home* (available at church) are easily packed, or you might consider an online devotional like **d365 Devotions** (www.d365.org) or **God Pause** (www.luthersem.edu/godpause).
- 4) **Join us for Dinner Church** July 10, 24 and August 14. These informal services on Wednesdays are a wonderful way to worship and connect with your church family.

Whenever you are able, please do join us for Sunday worship this summer! Throughout this season, our weekly readings from the gospel of Luke will guide us through Jesus’ ministry of healing and teaching, from parables like the Good Samaritan to his lessons on prayer. We will also be reading from the apostle Paul’s letters to the churches he planted in Galatia and Colossia, in which he instructs the people on the meaning of the gospel and what it means for us to follow Jesus.

The theme of this season of growth can be summed up in one central question: **“What does Christian discipleship look like in our daily lives?”** We’ll be exploring how our daily spiritual habits form us as followers of Jesus, and equip us to share his love with the world and our neighbor.

During these busy days of summer, I invite you to consider the spiritual habits that are part of your daily life. Where our regular schedules are disrupted, we find a wonderful opportunity to experiment with new habits, new ways to grow in relationship with God, and new ways for God to nurture our spiritual roots!

July Hymn of the Month

This summer, our worship services feature a “Hymn of the Month.” These songs are relatively new to Zion, and the hope is that repeating them a few Sundays in a row will help our congregation learn them well. You may even discover a new favorite!

Our July hymn is “You Have Come Down to the Lakeshore” (ELW 817), by Cesáreo Gabaráin (1936-1991), a Roman Catholic composer of hymns and liturgy from Spain.

Originally composed in Spanish and known as *Pescador de Hombres* (Fisher of Men), the hymn is based on the parallel accounts from the gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, of Jesus calling fishermen to be his first disciples. The lyrics capture the willingness of these disciples to give up everything to obediently answer Jesus’ call to seek “other seas” with him. The hymn invites us into the same spirit of humility and commitment as we answer Jesus’ call to follow him today.

According to Dr. C. Michael Hawn,* the hymn has been translated into more than 80 languages. The article further reports, “Gabaráin’s obituary noted that he ‘would simply smile’ when guides in Palestine boasted that ‘Pescador de Hombres’ was composed along the shores of Lake Tiberias, when, in fact, it was written in Madrid. Gabaráin, himself, knew the lake well as he frequently accompanied groups of pilgrims to the Holy Land.”



Update to Composting and Recycling

Members of the Green Team hope to have well-marked containers available later this year. For now, a list of items that can be recycled or composted is placed by each of the disposal areas. If you're unfamiliar with what goes where or have questions, please check out the list first. If you're still in doubt, throw it away. Please remember that plastic bags, wrapping, etc., are never recyclable or compostable in the kitchen or narthex areas. Plastic gloves used in food prep should go in the garbage and items such as paper towels or tissues can be composted in the bins with green liners. Thanks for taking a few additional moments to help dispose of items appropriately.

Prayer Shawls

Thank you to those who continue to bless others with a prayer shawl. New items are now available for those who are looking for a gift to someone dear to them.

Project Promise

During a spring Family Of Faith Event, Sunday school children and adult volunteers assembled additional school kits. Using the remaining dollars from Project Promise, more items were purchased so that all personal care kits could also be completed. All of these items will be shipped to Lutheran World Relief. The total items include 46 school kits and 33 personal care kits, 6 of which were donated by Miriam Circle.

PATRIOTIC PINWHEEL

Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5" x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- Drinking straw



What you do:


1. Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!

June Meeting Highlights

Finance and Stewardship: Conversations centered on Memorial Fund and Special Project Fund Accounts; additional research will take place to determine amount available for discretionary spending. Also, discussions in regard to a special appeal for reduction of the line of credit, and will be looking into a program to offer some challenge gifts to reduce the credit amount.

Social Ministry: Caring Coins gifts totaled \$213.27 in June, and were designated for the American Red Cross. Gifts thus far this year have totaled \$1,634.86. July's Caring Coins recipient is the Campus Kitchen at Crossroads Campus Ministry.

Membership & Outreach: Continued discussions and planning for a mentoring program for our new members. Also talked about a follow up phone call from our board to new members to further welcome them to the congregation and to answer any questions they may have. Twenty Five Moon Dogs Faith Night tickets have been ordered.

Building and Grounds: Thank you to those that helped during the Spring Clean-up day! Also, the remainder of the fascia and spouting work was scheduled for mid-June. The team will continue to do building assessments and to project pending issues before they become problems.

Youth Ministry: The positions of SS Superintendent, SS Music Coordinator and SS Christmas Program Coordinator remain unfilled. Pastor Andrea had 13 children attend the Communion Workshop in May. The workshop went well and will be considering offering it every other year. Marrett is working on a fellowship acting on June 23rd and also working on a budget proposal to implement the youth room renovations, including painting and furniture. Also, he is working with other area churches on Mission: Mankato.

Worship, Music and Adult Ed: Most discussions were around planning for the first Dinner Church on June 12th. Approximately 30 people were in attendance. Planning to set up the sign and get more posters up before the next session on June 26th. Also recapped the Communion workshop on May 19th. Feedback has been good so far, some first Communion celebrations are planned.

Council Actions & Discussions:

- Approval to reduce the Building Fund balance cushion by \$4,000 (From \$12,000 down to \$8,000).
- Approval to appoint Kristee Richards to fill the open seat on the Membership and Outreach Ministry Team. Discussion on working with the nominating committee to fill the remaining seat on the Finance and Stewardship Ministry Team was held.
- Discussion was held regarding building a Young Children Outreach Program, for children 0-3 years old. Families would receive books when baptized, then keeping those families connected through a newsletter for families, then when the child begins Sunday School, they will receive a Spark Bible.

Introducing SE MN Synod Bishop-Elect Regina Hassanally

CHICAGO – The Rev. Regina M. Hassanally, Goodhue, Minn., was elected June 1 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Southeastern Minnesota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly, held May 31 – June 1 at the Mayo Civic Center in Rochester, Minn.

Hassanally was elected on the fifth ballot, with 237 votes. The Rev. Emily Carson, the synod's director of communications, received 206.

The bishop-elect has served as pastor of St. Luke Lutheran Church in Goodhue since 2012, and as director of shared ministry at St. John's Lutheran Church in Northfield, Minn., from 2008 to 2012.


Hassanally received her Bachelor of Arts in biology–health professions from Northwestern College in Orange City, Iowa, in 2005, and her Master of Divinity degree from Palmer Theological Seminary in Wyncrow, Pa., in 2008. Her Lutheran year was spent at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minn., in 2011. Luther is one of seven ELCA seminaries.
