The Canadian Surgery Forum has become the premier surgical conference in Canada for general surgeons to come together to share their experiences and plan new ways to better the needs of their surgical societies.

In 2007 Dr. Fitzgerald was admitted as a Member to the Order of Canada. In 2018, the RCPSC recently honored Dr. Fitzgerald with the James H. Graham Award.

He was active in the Canadian Association of University Surgeons and served a term as president.

Other activities included membership in the James IV Association, the Surgeons Travel Club and the Medical Council of Canada.

He served as a volunteer with the Canadian Network for International Surgery providing courses in Africa in basic surgical skills to medical students and Medical Officers of Health. He is currently on the Board of CNIS.


Leisure activities include playing golf (badly), boating, reading and spending time with his wife Carol Greene at their lakeside cabin in western Newfoundland.
